## From the Pastor

th member, Rosemary Manchester, shared an Advent/Christmas poem with me, a poem r of one of her lifelong friends. The friend's father was a UCC minister. The last stanza of the

 vristmas always comes at night When men are hungriest for light! Can Wise Men see a star at noon? Can shepherds hear the Angel's tune When sun is bright?

Christmas comes in deepest dark When in despair man sees a spark Conquering the night!

This season, the season of our longest nights, is the season when we in the church dare to speak of that spark that conquers the night, of the Light that shines in the deepest darkness and cannot be overcome.

Speaking of this season, Kathleen Norris has said, "None of us knows what the next change is going to be, what unexpected opportunity is just around the corner, waiting a few months or a few years to change all the tenor of our lives." Or, as the grandmother of one of my UCC colleagues liked to say, the arrival of the Advent and Christmas season gave her the "anticipates". I love that word. It just might make an appearance in upcoming sermons.

I have shared over thirty Advent and Christmas seasons with you. And yet, every year, when I hear the familiar, haunting strains of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," I find myself with a case of the "anticipates". I like the waiting and watching and anticipation of this season. Our days are often as dark as our nights. Anxiety and fear seem to be so all-over-the-place. I worry about our world, I worry about my father, I worry about the church budget, I worry about those of you going through tough and challenging times. But then it's Advent – Advent with its invitation to keep hope and love and faith alive, even when the night is dark and we are far from home. For you just never know when the darkness will become the birthplace of unexpected opportunity, of new life and new possibilities... "just around the corner, waiting to change the tenor of our lives."

candlelight recessional to the courtyard. Nursery care will be available for this service only.


