### From Our Associate Pastor

Recently I had a discussion with a parent about ways to help her child transition to Sunday school more easily. I decided to come up with the top ways to help your child '*be more successful*' in Sunday school. As I did, I realized that these are actually ways that we all can be 'more successful' in church!

1. Commitment—Make 'going to church' part of your routine and be committed to bringing your child to Sunday school. Remember that all of our teachers are volunteering their precious time to developing a deeper relationship with your child.

2. Knowledge—know what is going on in their Sunday school class and ask your children questions. What was the story for the morning? What part of the story did they like the best?

3. Prayer—do you pray with your children? How can our children develop a deeper relationship with God if we don't teach them how?

4. Give—share with your child all of the ways that you give to the church. Do you volunteer to teach Sunday school, or volunteer in another way? On Sundays when the children are in church during the offering time, allow your children to place your family's offering in the collection plate.

5. Participate—the more often you and your family are at church, participating in all of the activities, the more familiar the church becomes to your children. Soon, the church buildings will become a second home to your family.

### FINANCIAL U P D A T E

The month of August was essentially a push for the operating fund, with income and expenses almost equal. That is good news and a good way to

finish the summer. But the push means that we still finished the month with an operating deficit of \$7,731 for the year. Pledge and plate income remained strong, actually exceeding projections – thank you for your faithfulness - but we did suffer from a summer drop off in facility rental. That should pick up in the coming months. Expenses remain slightly under our budget projections which is very good news. Last year, the month of September was a good income month for the church, but then in October offerings declined significantly. Hopefully this year our financial support can remain consistent each month.






