# From the Pastor

As I write this, Kristen and our senior high youth and advisors are preparing to depart on their spring mission trip to Boston. I am reminded of a mission trip story told by a pastor: "I was urging one of our high school students to go on the church spring mission trip. She had initially shown some interest. Her sister had gone with us some years before and I was eager for her to go as well. When I finally got back in touch with her, I was surprised to hear her say, 'I'm not going on any mission trip. I've decided. That's that. I am not going!"

" 'May I ask why?"

" 'Because Jane went with you, and it totally destroyed her life. When she came back from working with the poor, she wasn't the same person. She completely changed the course of her life. It disrupted our family, upset our parents, and things have never been the same again. I just don't want to bring that much disruption into our family." Says the pastor, "It was one of the best reasons I have ever heard for not going on a church mission trip." God forbid that we take the risk of allowing ourselves to be changed or our lives to be disrupted.

I have always found it interesting that the primary emotion expressed on that first Easter was not joy, not amazement, not surprise, but fear. The first encounter with the empty tomb produces fear. And I think I understand why. As sad and devastating as Jesus' death was for his followers, at least it was something they could understand. They could deal with death. But resurrection, new life, an explosion of life that not even death can overcome...how do you deal with that? It's one thing to grieve over a dead body in a tomb. But a living Lord now at large in the world, a living Lord who just might encounter us anytime and anywhere, a living Lord who might be interested in changing and disrupting our comfortable lives? Again, how do we deal with that?

Easter has passed and our new Pilgrim Center is up and running. I truly believe a new chapter in our life together is opening before us. I hope we are ready for and open to whatever disrupting surprises Christ might have in store for us.

# FINANCIAL U P D A T E

While income for February was certainly an improvement over January, we still fell short of matching our expenses. February

expenses exceeded income by \$2500, leaving us with a two month operating deficit of \$14,789. Both pledge income and facility use income are behind our projections, while plate income has been very strong. After two months, total operating expenses were \$1600 over our projections.

The good financial news is that our operating pledge total increased to \$266,325. This figure represents 128 households bring us to within \$4700 of our pledge goal for the year.


