## From the Pastor

A pastor shares this story: "A man in my congregation had dangerous open-heart surgery. He was told by his doctor that he had no more than a 50-50 chance of surviving the operation, but he chose to go forward with the surgery. And he did survive. When I visited him afterwards, I said, 'You did survive after all! Isn't that wonderful!'

"He answered, 'No preacher, I didn't just survive. I did more than survive. I was born again. I'm not the same person I have been for the past 50 years. It's like God reached into my life and, through this illness, made me somebody better than I ever was before. I've been given a second chance and I'm going to be different...better than before."

Concludes this preacher, "Once again, God in Christ had made an advent into a life and, just by showing up, just by intruding into time, had transformed time."

Advent...the four Sundays before the great celebration of Christmas. How can we already be so close to Advent? It seems like I just put away our large, inflatable Halloween pumpkin! (doesn't every family have one?) Advent...a season of preparation, of getting ready. But for what? The man who survived that dangerous heart surgery could tell us. We are getting ready for nothing less than a divine intrusion - God reaching into our time and into our lives, disrupting and transforming us, our time becoming God's time.

How odd that we tend to think of the story of Jesus' birth as something that happened long ago in the distant past. For the fact of the matter is that the then and there of his birth has intruded into our here and now. Because of that birth, something is afoot that is way beyond our conceptions of what can and can't be. God with us; God in our time; no where to hide. Jesus is now more of our present and future than of our past. We had best be ready!

### A NOTE FROM GENE

I know that as you read this, most of you have already made your financial commitment to the church for 2014. And thank you for that! But I just wanted to say a brief word about the ministry and outreach we share. Often there are significant moments that most of you don't see. On the weekend of Nov. 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, there were two memorial services at our church – one in the chapel and one in the sanctuary. Both were for people with no affiliation with our church and the vast majority of people who attended had no affiliation with our church. The service in the chapel was small, about 30 people, but the one in sanctuary on Sunday was huge with about 250 people. Each was followed by a reception at church.

I officiated at both, but a number of our folks were involved with the services and behind the scenes: Keith Blackstone, Karin Seder, Gail Thomas, Darryl Fenley, Andy DelMonte, Joanne Matson, Janet Minton and Norma Watson. They all went the second mile to reach out to these families and the families were deeply appreciative. I doubt if either of those services will bring us new church members, but they were an important ministry. We provided a safe space where people could come and share memories, stories, grief, laughter, tears and yes, faith. People felt welcomed and cared for, and again, were immensely grateful. Having this place to come together made a huge difference. I just told folks that that is what we do around here.

Just one of the many forms of ministry and outreach which you support; one of the many ways you make a difference in Sebastopol and West County. Thanks.
