



From the Pastor



In a recent sermon I mentioned the Thomas Hardy character, Farmer Oak. He stood at the window and saw a young woman go back and forth, every morning and every evening, to milk the cows. He just watched her go every day with the pails empty and full. Eventually he fell in love with her there behind the glass, in the house, looking out the window. He loved her, but she never knew because he was afraid - afraid to say anything to her.

When it comes to sharing our church experience, my guess is that many of us are like Farmer Oak. I'll admit it, even as a pastor of this church, I find it is hard, even fearful, to talk to others about our church and to invite others to join us for worship. It feels so pushy, perhaps even rude. And what if they refuse? And yet, if you don't say something how will they ever know? People often comment on my newspaper columns, but columns don't bring many people to church. Many in town are commenting on the beauty of our new Pilgrim Center, but while the new building raises our visibility, it doesn't bring many people to church. Words and buildings don't bring people to church. People bring people to church; you bring people to church!

I am daily thankful that we remain a healthy and vibrant congregation. But we really aren't growing much if at all. So I want to spend time this summer thinking with you about outreach, about growth, about how we can share our story. It is a story worth sharing. And I want to invite you to share it...with a friend, a family member, a colleague. Is there someone you know who might find our church as meaningful as you have found it? For it remains true: Wherever we go, there goes the church of Jesus Christ, there goes The Community Church of Sebastopol.



month \$11,000 behind our pledge income projections for the first four months of the year. Fortunately plate income remained ahead of projections and Memorial Hall income was strong. But overall we finished the month with a \$3500 operating deficit, leaving us with a year to date operating deficit of \$10,615. It remains an income issue for us because year to date operating expenses were only \$560 over projections.
