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From the Pastor

Humorist, Dave Barry, once wrote how astounded his children were when he told them that he remembered when it was possible to open a bottle of aspirin with one hand. Yes, he told them, there was once a time when pills didn't come with child-safe tops that often require an advanced degree in engineering to be opened. They had trouble believing that in those long ago days – no doubt when dinosaurs roamed the earth – all you had to do was put your thumb under the top and it popped right off!

Of course, in these more safety-conscious times, we are all familiar with the warning...**IF THE PROTECTIVE SEAL IS BROKEN, DO NOT USE!!!** If the seal is broken, there could be danger - the contents may not be safe. If the seal is broken...It occurs to me that this might not be a bad warning for people of faith as we move through Lent toward Holy Week and Easter. For Easter is all about a broken seal, a seal that was thought to be safe and secure, a seal that was meant to keep things the way they had always been, a seal that proved unable to keep the dangerous contents inside.

I always find it interesting that the word, fear, is a part of the Easter story. I suspect that few if any of us will feel fear when we come to worship on Easter Sunday. (except, of course, the fear that the preacher might go on too long!) But we are told that when the women discovered the empty tomb on that first Easter, they were afraid. And they were right to be afraid. The seal had not worked. Jesus was alive, a new world was being born, and nothing would ever be the same again. A world that had made its peace with death found itself invaded by new life.

One could say that Easter marks the beginning of a new world where nothing is certain, not even death. It might have been easier on us if that stone at the door of the tomb, that protective seal, had actually worked. Now we can no longer return to normal. We can't even count on the darkness. All we know for sure is that a risen Savior is on the loose...and he knows our names.
