From the Pastor

A pastor shares a time when he missed the church Trustees meeting the night they voted on the budget for the next year. The chairperson called the pastor the next morning and told him what a great meeting they had. In her words, "It was as if the Holy Spirit descended on us. We unanimously approved next year's budget...a ten percent increase over this year's. It was wonderful!" When the pastor regained consciousness, he told her that a congregation that was struggling to meet the current year's budget had no chance of handling a ten percent increase. But she responded, "Well, you weren't there and we've already voted and that's that!"

During the month of October, the Trustees had a Stewardship Moment during each worship service. At the end of the month, the Trustees Chair stood up in worship and said, "I never thought I'd live to see this day, in this church. I am pleased to announce, even though there were some who insisted we could never pledge this budget, that we have pledged next year's budget in full, even with the ten percent increase!" The church erupted in spontaneous applause. Reflecting on that moment, the pastor says, "Sometimes I fear those strange, glorious moments when the church becomes the body of Christ and the kingdom of God breaks out among us."

Years ago, when we completed Memorial Hall, the senior minister of this church did not believe we would ever have another building campaign, at least not while he was around...would never complete that dream of a chapel and new education and youth rooms. Never happen! Months ago, the senior minister of this church did not believe that we could reach a pledge goal of \$271,000. Never happen...except that it did happen! What's wrong with you people? No one listens to a word I say...thank goodness! It sure can be hard to predict just where and when God's Spirit will blow in and through our life together. But know this...it will, it surely will. Let's be ready for whatever God has in store for us next.

### FINANCIAL U P D A T E

Church finances showed a significant improvement in the month of March. Operating income exceeded

expenses by \$7700. This still left us with a year to date deficit of a little

over \$7000, but at least we were moving in the right direction! Pledge income improved, but still lagged behind our year to date projections, but plate income was quite strong, exceeding projections. Operating expenses for the first quarter of the year were \$1300 over projections, so our spending is quite close to what we expected.

And there was positive news concerning 2014 pledges. At our Annual Meeting, we voted an ambitious pledge goal of \$271,000. We have now exceeded that goal, with our pledge total standing at \$271,425! Of course, new pledges are always welcome...and needed. Thank you all for your ongoing faithfulness and commitment.

Dear Friends in Christ:

It's an old cartoon, depicting the day Adam and Eve are driven from the Garden of Eden. As they are leaving, he turns to her and says, "My Dear, we live in a time of transition." Well, the same thing can be said about our church. We are about to enter into a time of transition.

The Rev. Kristen DelMonte has recently been accepted into the teaching credential program at Sonoma State. She will begin classes in the Fall of this year. While we are very pleased for her and excited with her as she begins this new phase of her life, it means that for our church significant changes are coming. Beginning in September, Kristen will reduce her workload at the church to 15 hours a week. Details are still being worked out with the pastoral relations and personnel committees, but the plan is that she will continue her work with the church school and youth groups and will be at the church on Wednesdays and Sundays. The plan is not to add any additional staff at this time, but to use the Fall as a time to evaluate our staff needs.

In the new year, 2014, Kristen will begin her student teaching and may have to reduce her time with us even more. At this time we may need to look into adding at least some part time staff. And when the school year, 2013-14 is over, she will leave her position at the church in order to pursue a teaching career. So certainly by summer, 2014, we will need to be in a position to make decisions concerning our long term staff needs.

We enter into a significant time of discernment and strategic planning. Everyone's input will be important. And may God continue to richly bless us during this next phase of our shared journey.


