From the Rastor

An Advent Reflection from Madeleine L'Engle: "First Coming":

God did not wait till the world was ready, till...nations were at peace.

God came when the Heavens were unsteady, and prisoners cried out for release.

God did not wait for the perfect time, God came when the need was deep and great.

God dined with sinners in all their grime, turned water into wine. God did not wait

till hearts were pure. In joy God came to a tarnished world of sin and doubt.

To a world like ours God came, and God's Light would not go out.

We cannot wait till the world is sane to raise our songs with joyful voice.

For to share our grief, to touch our pain, God came with Love:

Rejoice! Rejoice!

"God did not wait..." I suspect that as we get nearer to December 25th, many of us – and that would include me – are going to feel that we are not ready. So much to do - so little time. We are not ready for this! Says one poet – "Time running out, money running out, patience running out." But Christmas doesn't seem to care if we are ready or not. It is not bound by our schedules. It refuses to wait... God refuses to wait. And just maybe that is good news.

Says one colleague, "In memory, we lace the Christmas story with angelic choirs, softly lowing cattle and attentive shepherds. That is the poetry by which, quite rightly, we remember Christmas. But what really happened, happened as all things usually happen – in the midst of the hustle and bustle, the grit and grime, of everyday life."

It just might be that there is no perfect time when we are "ready" for Christmas. There are no ideal conditions for encountering God. The message of Christmas is that we shall either be alert for signs of the holy in the commonplace or we might miss it altogether. We shall see God in simple things – like the birth of a baby or at a noisy family table – or we may not see God at all. God will find us where we are – at Christmas or any other time of the year. The poet again:

Wise men still watch and wonder
And pause to look for the stars in people's eyes,
And to listen for angel-singing in the night.
O, let us busy ones wise up and watch for joy again!



We took a step back financially in October. Operating expenses exceeded revenue by \$5,773. This wiped out our positive balance from the previous month and left us with an operating deficit of \$1,761. Pledge

income remained lower than expectations. We finished with income about \$4,000 behind our 10 month projections, plate income remained strong, but income from facilities use lagged.
