From the Pastor

It's an old quote, but as we move into summer, I think I will share it again - Brother Jeremiah's "If I Had My Life to Live Over." "If I had my life to live over again, I'd try to make more mistakes next time. I would relax. I would limber up. I would be sillier than I have been this trip. I know of very few things I would take seriously. I would take more trips. I would climb more mountains, swim more rivers and watch more sunsets. I would do more walking and looking. I would eat more ice cream and fewer beans. I would have more actual troubles and fewer imaginary ones. You see, I am one of those people who lives sensibly and sanely hour after hour, day after day. Oh, I've had my moments, and if I had it to do over again, I'd have more of them. In fact, I'd try to have nothing else. Just moments...one after another, instead of living so many years ahead each day. I have been one of those people who never go anywhere without a thermometer, a hot water bottle, a raincoat, aspirin and parachute. If I had it to do over again, I would go places, do things and travel lighter than I have. If I had my life to do over, I would ride on more merry-go-rounds...pick more daisies."

July and August open before us. Certainly our many responsibilities and obligations are not going to disappear simply because of warm, long days. And yet, perhaps these can be days when we stop to remember and appreciate that we are alive right now, rather than just living our lives without noticing; when we dare to take some time simply to enjoy the "holy ordinary," when we explore the paradox of slowing down to see more.

I like these words of Suzanne Guthrie, an Episcopal priest: "My husband and I live on an organic farm with a group of Episcopal nuns. I love my thrillingly dull life. We grow food, we pray. Recently, while we were all gathered around a table admiring a cross-section of radish, a member of the community and I simultaneously experienced a sense of absurdity. We locked eyes and burst out laughing. Embracing the ordinary takes some remedial adjustment. After having spent a lifetime multitasking, strategizing and squeezing to 'get the most out of every moment', stopping to admire a cross-section of radish seems way too funny. We're learning how to fit less into a minute not more. A slice of radish becomes as portal into the sacrament of the present moment."

Discovering a passion for the ordinary...striving to find the beauty all around us, in nature and imagination...slowing down to see more. So pick more daisies and have a great summer! Gene



FINANCIAL UPDATE

In the month of May we experienced a small bounce back in church finances. For the month, operating receipts exceeded expenses by a thousand

dollars. However, this still left us with a five month operating deficit of \$15,742. Both pledge income and plate income remained below projections for the year, and income from use of facilities also lagged. The good news is that five month expenses remained about \$7000 below projections. So we still have a ways to go, but the good news is that early returns indicate a strong pledge income for June.


