August proved to be another strong month for our church financially. Operating income exceeded expenses by a little over a thousand dollars, leaving us with a month end operating balance of \$13,673. That is

very encouraging as we move into the fall months which always bring increased program expenses. Through eight months, both our pledge income and plate income have exceeded projections. Facility use income is somewhat below what we projected, but really remained consistent during the summer months. Also, operating expenses for the first eight months were \$11,000 below projections which also helped. Again, our Fall program season always brings financial challenges, but as we exit the summer, thank you all for your continued faithful financial support of the many ministries of our church.

NEIGHBORS IN NEED OFFERING



On Sunday, October 4, we will receive the yearly Neighbors In Need (NIN) special offering. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants.

The 2015 theme for NIN is "Unexpected Places" and connects to the work of the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM) and our denominational advocacy to address centuries of injustice stemming from the Doctrine of Discovery. Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S.
