Faith and Evolution Rev. Benjamin Broadbent

For the past 10 years I have participated a multi-faith effort by clergy (www.theclergyletterproject.org) to encourage the idea that religion and science need not be in conflict. This year, on February 12, I want to explore "cooperation" as a crossover theme between Christian theology and the modern theory of evolution. One of my former professors at Harvard Divinity School, Dr. Sarah Coakley, observes that "cooperation must be counted a third evolutionary principle alongside the classic Darwinian duo of mutation and selection." Many evolutionary theorists think that evolution is not based solely on "selfishness" but also "cooperation." In other words, sheer competitiveness leads to annihilation while cooperation improves chances of survival.

But what does this have to do with faith? Some theologians have argued that the distinctive Christian name for God is "Trinity." An interrelation of Creator, Christ, and Holy Spirit, the Trinitarian God is not a self-sufficient individual being, but a mutually loving relationship between equal partners. This model of cooperation at the heart of the Christian witness is the basis of what it means to be the social creature known as "the church." If our God is essentially co-operative, then so should we be. Cooperation is how we learn, grow, survive, and even thrive.

In the coming weeks, try paying attention to the Sunday morning readings from the Gospel of Matthew. To my ear, they are all about cooperation. In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus addresses the basic facts of human nature, then suggests concrete ways to move beyond selfishness into modes of cooperation. Jesus' words are non-conventional and challenging, to be sure, but Jesus just might be helping his disciples, and all of us, evolve into a new creature known as the beloved community.

office and we will see that it gets put to good use. Thank you!




