# From the Pastor

# The Lengthening of Days Rev. Benjamin Broadbent

On March 1, Ash Wednesday, we begin the season of Lent, 40 days plus Sundays culminating in Holy Week, and ending on Easter Sunday, April 16. I recently learned that the word "Lent" comes from an old word meaning lengthen, referring to the lengthening of days that happens in the Northern Hemisphere during Spring.

Even as the days grow longer, Lent is a penitential season, that is, a time for individuals, and society as a whole, to name where we've gone wrong, to seek reconciliation with God and neighbor, and to commit anew to lives built around justice and peacemaking. This year, that work seems particularly urgent in light of our divisive and fear-based politics.

During Lent this year at Community Church, we will use the image of a loom to weave together "**5 Spiritual Survival Strategies**" described in an article by Wes Granberg-Michaelson of Sojourners (https://sojo.net/print/221755). Here's an outline:

- "Weaving Memory" (March 5) Much of Christian faith is about remembering who we are, and who God is, underneath the noise of the 24 hour news cycle.
- "Weaving Truth" (March 12) For Christians, telling the truth is a spiritual matter, as well as the basis of a just social order.
- "Weaving Community" (March 19) Christian identity is formed in a community centered around what it means to pick up our cross and follow Jesus.
- "Weaving Suffering" (March 26) Some form of suffering, or lack of control, is necessary to teach us how to give control back to God.

As the days lengthen, let us notice how the weft of intentional spiritual practices is woven through the warp of daily life to create a fabric that is both beautiful and resilient.

#### **Generosity + Gratitude: Questions about Giving & Budgets**

"A budget is a mission statement." We're not sure who said that, but someone did, and it still rings true. A budget – whether of a household, a church, or a nation - is both a statement about what is important and a plan for how to bring what's important into being.

At the January 22 Annual Meeting of our congregation, the church membership approved a budget that seeks to do the following:

- Continue Community Church's tradition of inclusive and engaging ministry
- Compensate staff members fairly and competitively
- Support existing programs and develop new programs for all ages
- Improve and maintain our facilities in service of church and wider community programs

In support of the 2017 budget, 142 households pledged \$326,494 to our church's local ministry and an additional \$30,996 to wider mission. What a generous outpouring of support for our life and work together!

As we live into the 2017 budget, we want to address a few questions that church members are asking:

What is the best way to pay my pledged offering? A check in the offering plate or sent to the church office works well. Many members report that giving through their bank's "Bill Pay" service is convenient and helps them stay consistent.

How often should I make a payment on my pledge? It depends on your situation. Some folks make an annual gift. Others give throughout the year. Most folks make a regular monthly gift, which can help us better predict income flow throughout the year.

What if something changes and I need to adjust the pledge I made? Just let us know, specifically Jennifer Halleck, our Bookkeeper, at <a href="mailto:financial@uccseb.org">financial@uccseb.org</a> or 707.823.2484, x103.

What's the difference between local church ministry and wider mission? The local church ministry portion of our budget (formerly called "operating") includes personnel, facility, and program expenses. The wider mission portion of the budget includes funds directed outside our local congregation, including the InterChurch Food Pantry (\$15,000) and our congregation's Basic Support of the wider settings of our denomination, the United Church of Christ (\$9,000).

If I designated a gift to a special mission such as the Inter-Church Pantry, will my gifts go there? Yes, in fact, your pledge made it possible for us to increase our overall giving to the Food Pantry from \$12,755 in 2016 to \$15,000 in 2017.
