#### War is (Still) Not the Answer

Lately I have been working my way through books on my office shelves that I had once purchased but never read. The most recent was "War Is a Force that Gives Us Meaning" which Christ Hedges wrote in 2002 after serving as a war correspondent during conflicts in El Salvador, Bosnia, and Irag. Hedges observes that war seduces whole societies, creating and perpetuating myths while silencing critical voices. The mindset of war, Hedges argues, destroys culture, subverts history, and hijacks memory.

It was a scary and fascinating read, especially as the season of Lent drew to a close and as our own presidential administration pivoted toward war-making, sending 59 missiles to an airbase in Syria, dropping the largest conventional bomb ever developed on Afghanistan, and threatening North Korea with a preemptive attack that would lead to an all-out war.

What a contrast to the Holy Week narrative of an unarmed Jew in occupied Israel choosing nonviolent resistance in the face of imperial pretensions. I find it bewildering that some Christians have used the story of Jesus' death to justify violent self-preservation. The Prince of Peace - came to offer another way, the way of active non-violence that exposes pretensions and forges new relationships through compassion, grace, and forgiveness. Easter is God's vindication of Jesus' peace-seeking servantleadership rather than bombastic bellicosity.



Both of our groups have the exciting opportunity to put our faith into action this summer and we can't wait to share our stories with the congregation once we are back!


#### LET'S GET CREATIVE

#### OUR WHOLE LIVES (OWL) PROGRAM STARTING FALL 2017

The Christian Education Committee is planning to launch the Our Whole Lives - sexuality and our faith program for our 4/5th graders in the Fall. Our Whole Lives (OWL) is a comprehensive sexuality education curriculum for Kindergarten through Young Adult that helps participants make informed and responsible decisions about their sexual health and behavior. The UCC & Unitarians co-wrote the faith component



of the program, with one of the Community Church of Sebastopol's former Associate Pastors (Rev. Lizann Bassham) as one of the authors. The 4/5th grade curriculum covers the following topics over 8 lessons: value s and sexuality, family relationships, puberty, gender identity & sexual orientation, reproduction, health and safety, communication, and decision making. This 8-week series will be offered during the 9:00 education hour in the Fall, concluding before Thanksgiving.

The Christian Education Ministry Team has identified two coleaders for this program: Brooke Bell and Pete Emerson. They will attend a three-day intensive training on Our Whole Lives curriculum for elementary and upper elementary age children this summer, so that they are prepared to lead the classes in the Fall.

Anyone who's interested in looking at the curriculum is welcome to stop by the church office. The OWL curriculum spans Kindergarten through young adult, and those materials will be available for anyone to peruse. Our focus in the Fall 2017 is 4/5th grade.

#### THE CHURCH COUNCIL ADOPTS A SAFE CHURCH POLICY

In October, the Church Council tasked Pastor Rachel with forming a team with the goal of creating a Safe Church Policy for our church. She recruited four faithful souls—Pete Emerson, Laurie Kellner, Pat Furber, and Linda Inman. The Safe Church Team presented a draft of the document to the Council at their March meeting, received feedback and in the following weeks, made revisions and produced a final draft. The Safe Church Policy was presented and approved by vote of the Council at their April meeting.

The Safe Church Policy reflects our commitment to preserve our church as a holy place of safety and protection for all who would enter and as a place in which all people can experience the love of God through relationships with others. The goal of the Safe Church Policy is to establish norms and guidelines that will make our congregation a safe space for all, especially those who are most vulnerable in our congregation. In particular, the Safe Church Policy seeks to protect children, youth, and vulnerable adults from sexual harassment, physical, emotional, and sexual abuse. The Policy states: "We do not tolerate *child abuse, elder abuse, sexual abuse,* and *sexual harassment* in any form, as defined by the State of California."

As the Safe Church Policy is being enacted, you might notice some changes to our procedures at church, here are a few:

- If you are volunteering with children or youth, you will be asked to complete a background check.
- We will have two adults in a room with children at all times.
- Parents will need to sign-in and sign-out children from church activities.
- Classrooms will have either a window or an open door for visibility.

The Safe Church Team is also working to bring to the congregation a series of speakers in 2017, to cover topics such as identifying and preventing elder abuse, child and youth safety, and maintaining proper boundaries.

A copy of the Policy is in the church office and will be posted on the church web site. Many thanks to Pete Emerson, Pat Furber, Laurie Kellner, Linda Inman, and Pastor Rachel for their faithful service in preparing the Safe Church Policy.




During the summer months, our church choirs and music groups are on summer hiatus, providing you the opportunity to help shape worship for at least one Sunday this summer.
