The Last Temptations of Prayer

This year during Lent we will explore "The Last Temptations of Prayer." Many of us have questions about prayer that are hard to answer: Who am I praying to? What effect does praying have? What should I pray for? What's the point?

Over the six weeks of Lent, we will explore some temptations, or pitfalls, of prayer that we tend to slip into. Here are the first three, which echo the devil's temptations of Jesus in Matthew 4:1-11:

1. The Consumerist Temptation – 'Prosperity Gospel' preachers claim that God wants to shower material blessings upon those who pray. But is prayer about getting stuff from God, or is it about something else entirely?
2. The Merit Temptation – Many of us approach prayer wanting to appear worthy of God's love and attention. But hasn't Jesus already assured us of God's constant loving attention with no prerequisites or strings attached?
3. The 'Holy Expert' Temptation – "Pastor, I need you to pray for me. You know how to pray, so I know God will be listening." Is prayer really more effective when it's done by professionals?

"To clasp the hands in prayer," Karl Barth once said, "is the beginning of an uprising against the disorder of the world." During Lent, Christians endeavor to pray, not as a withering retreat from the world, but so that we might see the world, and learn to love the world, as God does.

FEBRUARY 2018 WORSHIP

Sunday Worship Services are at 10:30 a.m. in the sanctuary
Children's Worship in the Chapel follows the Children's Message

Our 2018 Lenten theme for worship is "The Last Temptations of Prayer." We will be exploring the pitfalls that get in the way of prayer.

February 4 – 5th Sunday after Epiphany

Today we gather for multi-generational worship with Holy Communion. The Handbell Ensemble provides worship music and Rev. Benjamin Broadbent, Senior Minister, preaches on Mark 2:13-17, "A Table Where All Are Welcome."

February 11 – 6th Sunday after Epiphany / Transfiguration Sunday

On this last Sunday before the season of Lent, Rev. Broadbent preaches a sermon on Matthew 16:13-17:9, "Transfiguring Power."

February 14 – Ash Wednesday

At 5:45 p.m., we gather in the chapel for an all-ages Ash Wednesday service, with Imposition of Ashes, followed by a soup supper at 6:15 in Fellowship Hall.

February 18 – 1st Sunday in Lent

On this first Sunday in Lent, we explore "The Consumerist Temptation," that is, the tendency to make prayer about getting something from God. Rev. Broadbent preaches a sermon on Matthew 4:1-4, the beginning of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness.

February 25 – 2nd Sunday in Lent

Today we explore "The Merit Temptation" in prayer, the idea that we need to pray correctly or with the right spirit to merit God's love and attention. Rev. Broadbent preaches on Matthew 4:5-7.

Coming in March... Multi-Generational Worship with Holy Communion, "The Holy Expert Temptation," "The Spectacle Temptation," "The Formulaic Temptation," Palm/Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday.


