Was Jesus Political?

Rev. Benjamin Broadbent, Senior Minister

Church people sometimes debate whether politics belong in church. Some say, "Of course, just look at the prophets advocating on behalf of the poor and marginalized." Others say, "No way, I come to church to escape political opinions, and I especially don't want the preacher telling me what my political views should be."

As a preacher myself, I can empathize with both views. I've heard sermons that are so apolitical they seem disconnected from real life. And I've heard sermons that are so politicized they force me to disagree because they don't admit enough room for minority opinions.

I think Jesus was most definitely political. Jesus' whole life – his birth, ministry, teaching, death, and resurrection – was political because Jesus was concerned with how people organized, lead, and treated each other. He used a political image, the "kingdom of God," to describe his vision of a world marked by inclusion, forgiveness, and healing. This vision was an alternative to the prevailing system of separation, blame, and chronic dis-ease.

As we continue through the summer and explore issues that burst the bubble of what we can talk about in church, let us aspire to be political without being partisan, provocative without prescribing, ponderous without patronizing. Good politics should be connected to real life while making room - for minority opinions, and the church has a chance to model that for the rest of our society.



THE FUTURE OF MUSIC IN WORSHIP

Your applause after groups and individuals sing or play music during our Sunday worship service, tells me you appreciate our efforts and agree that music is an important part of the service.

All but a very few of the musicians in all our choirs, are either eligible for Medicare (age 65) or rapidly approaching it. Hand rails were added this past year that enabled several Chancel Choir members to continue with the choir. When I joined in the fall of 1983, there were more than 30 choir members. Today we average less than half that number – in part because many of us retired folk travel more than we had before.

While both the Bell Choir and the Chancel Choir have attracted new members, we need more participants. We know from your comments after the Christmas and Easter services when our choir membership numbers swell, that we sound better with more voices helping to make a "joyful noise."

Time changes our preferences, and maybe it's time for something new.

It took 4 individuals to get together and create our musical group the Divine Connection, and it will take people in the pews to step forth and tell Brian that you and some fellow members (or non- members) would like to provide worship music occasionally. Or you may want to join in for practice Wednesday evenings to learn to ring bells or Thursday evenings to sing. At least 4 of our current members cannot read music, so that is not a disqualifying condition!

Until I was 45, I just sang in the pew, ignoring appeals for more voices in the choir. Then one week I showed up at choir practice and sat between the two guys with Bass voices. I'd never sung parts, but the choir director was patient and would help until got it right. I have enjoyed the choir for the past 35 years, regretting only that I didn't start earlier, as I no longer see both words and notes clearly, making learning new music more challenging – but Brian is patient.

What's the future I'd music in our church? That's up to all of us. Come give it a try!



Many of you were in worship on June 3rd when I had a moment to share my retirement plans with our congregation. If you weren't there, I am happy to update you now.



Safe Parking Volunteers Needed

Homelessness is an ongoing problem in our county and has been made worse by the fires of last year.

The Community Church, with help from Catholic Charities in Santa Rosa, will be restarting our Safe Parking program. Safe Parking will allow people that have no other place to sleep, other than in their car, to stay the night in a safe environment on our church property. The program will allow up to 5 vehicles to park from 8:00pm to 8:00am. Many participating in this program are families with jobs and children attending school. All participants will be screened by Catholic Charities and must participate in Catholic Charities' intake program to avail themselves to services that will hopefully find them a home.

Safe Parking at our church will only work if we have Site Volunteers. Site Volunteers will be needed to welcome participants, show them where to park, provide them with a Safe Parking Dashboard Placard and show them how to get access to bathrooms. Site Volunteers would also be asked to drive through the lot once a night to see that only vehicles registered in the program are on the premises.
