Through Christ All Things

Rev. Benjamin Broadbent, Lead Minister

Through Christ all things were made; without Christ nothing was made that has been made. – John 1:3

As the Christian liturgical calendar moves from Advent through Christmas to Epiphany, we in the church have a sense of new beginnings. It could be said, without much overgeneration, that Christians are

without much exaggeration, that Christians are those who come who expect newness. The fate of the world and our lives is not fixed but open, the status quo is constantly being interrupted by a wild and holy Spirit bent on renewing the earth and reconciling all creatures.

"Sure, sure," I hear someone saying, "But what does that look like in practice, especially when everything seems both broken and stuck?" I think the answer has something to do with Epiphany, which means a "to shine forth," or "to show." The presence of God's love is not always obvious, but sometimes it is. Sometimes God's presence shines forth in an epiphany that cannot be ignored.



- If you were in worship on December 18, you might have glimpsed an epiphany in the Re-affirmation of Baptism. A young transgender person who grew up in this congregation released his former name and was affirmed with a new name.
- If you went caroling last month, you might have witnessed an epiphany on the doorstep of someone in a wheelchair closing her eyes and singing along with familiar and abiding words, "...heaven, and heaven and nature sing."
- Perhaps your glimpse of God's shining forth was something only you noticed, a person's unique smile, a genuine 'thank you,' a generous financial gesture, a glorious crisp winter evening.

In her painting, "Through Him, All Things," Lauren Wright Pittman uses the image of Christ as a prism shining light in all the colors of the rainbow. The light of Christ shines, yes, and it shines diverse colorful beauty in all the earth. By faith we affirm that this is the nature of all things. Through Christ, the light of the world, all things are created, and all things sustained, and all things made beautiful and new. This is the true epiphany always on offer for those who have eyes to see.

- 4. Will you attempt, by the grace of God, to follow in the way of Jesus as his disciple, to resist oppression and violence, to show love and justice, and to embody the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able?
- 5. As a member of the church of Jesus Christ, do you intend to grow in the Christian faith, joining in the dynamic movement of God's people in this local congregation and as part of the global church by sharing in its joys and sorrows, listening to and learning from people older and younger, and by sharing your own gifts and perspectives so that together we may celebrate Christ's presence and serve this community and the world in Christ's name?

Safe Church: A Care Note from Pastor Rachel

Dear Friends,

As a parent of teenagers, I am always feeling like I'm catching up with what is going on with technology, and especially with the content on their electronic devices. Recently, I looked at the ads popping up on an app on my child's phone, and was pretty upset by what I saw: highly sexualized commercials. I had to figure out next steps to remove this content. (I'm not sure the problem is totally solved, but it's improved...for now... somehow there are always more workarounds to the work arounds.) Why would this kind of content even be on an app aimed at people under the age of 20? Ugh! I suppose on the positive side, this episode prompted more conversation about sexualization in media, and how we can keep thinking about staying healthy around technology.

Parents of children and teenagers these days are often caught in the double bind of wanting to provide a safe environment while also allowing their children to connect with peers. It is an issue that requires constant vigilance. I bring all this up in the context of Safe Church because the teams who have written and revised our Safe ChurchPolicy have had to grapple with online safety– how can we provide safe and connecting programs in this always-unfolding social environment with technology?

As you may know, our Safe Church Policy was originally created by a team in 2018, and recently revised in 2021. With the revision, one of the topics the team expanded upon is social media and how to be safe in all our communications, especially texting. An example of how Adult Volunteers (like Youth Group Leaders, Confirmation Mentors, event planners, etc.) can safely communicate with youth is by adding a second adult (usually a parent) to a texting thread. A simple strategy to remember this, which we'll cover in the Safe Church Training, is to remember the two-adult rule: the policy states that we will have two background-checked adults with children and youth at all times during our programs. This is true for both in-person and virtual settings.

Our church is striving to create a wholesome environment for our young people. Part of creating a healthy place for our youth is about building camaraderie through service-oriented Christian programming. Another part of it is our robust Safe Church Policy. Indeed, we are a church seeking to "provide a safe and secure environment for children, youth, and vulnerable adults, as a reflection of the love and hospitality we have come to know in Jesus Christ" (from the preamble to the policy). A Safe Church Policy is more than just background-checks and the two-adult rule (though it is definitely those things too!). In the Safe Church Training for Adult Volunteers, we'll talk about honoring the spiritual lives of children, including simple ways to engage with children, without objectifying them. We'll think through strategies for being a trustworthy adult presence in the lives of our youth, without seeking to be a "peer." We'll talk about self-care and boundary-setting. And we'll think through some "gray area" scenarios and how to handle them.

So! **Save the Date for January 8th, 12-1:30pm!** I'll be leading a Safe Church Training for Adult Volunteers, required for all volunteers who work with children and youth. This is also open to all parents of children and youth. I'll also be offering a separate training for the youth-only, during a Youth Group gathering on January 8th, 5-7pm. Our young people need to know what the policy says too.

I look forward to engaging in conversation with many of you at this training and beyond. And if anyone has figured out how to totally block ads on all of social media, let me know!

Wondering Circle

Wondering Circle is our Sunday morning program for children up to grade 5. It is a vibrant and growing community of children and adult volunteers. In the month of December, we had around 10 children per week attending Wondering Circle. They engaged the Advent story in imaginative ways– thinking about the prophets, the holy family, shepherds, and magi. Research has shown that this style of storytelling and story-wondering encourages children to remember Bible stories, because they have imagined themselves inside of the story. It is really pretty profound, when children are given a quiet moment to reflect, they often have deep insights. Recently, when wondering about the shepherds hearing choirs of angels in the night, they were asked, "I wonder where you might be in this story?" One child answered, "I would like to be with the sheep because nobody expects too much from them, but they get to see and notice everything." Another child responded to the story with a gray-scale pencil drawing of a shepherd with sheep– the only color on the page a bright glowing star.

After the scripture story is told in worship (Children's Message), children and adult volunteers walk over to Room 5 for art, prayer, and singing. The "Leader" settles the group in with circle songs and a gathering time, and then leads a discussion about the story using "Wondering Questions" from Godly Play. The "Helper" assists the children in accessing art supplies, sits alongside any who need assistance, and supports the "Leader" in creating a sweet space for the children.
