

Why are we doing this?

- Worship and Faith Formation are two halves of a whole. As an intergenerational community, we believe that children belong in worship with adults, and that adults benefit from quality faith formation opportunities as much as children do.
- Returning from the social isolation of Covid, people are longing to spend time with other people in meaningful ways beyond the worship hour.
- Change is good, although it can be hard. A new schedule will release new energies and glimpses of new growth for individuals and the whole community.

Who made this decision? The pastors, following conversations with worship and faith formation leaders, presented the idea to the 8 elected members of the church's Leadership Council, which approved it unanimously at its July meeting.

What will Sunday mornings look like?

- NURSERY will reopen to extend hospitality to parents and their children, infants through age 4.
- WORSHIP will end by 11:00 a.m. to enable a smooth flow from worship to Faith Formation Hour.

11:00 - Kinship Time

11:15 - Faith Formation Hour

- KINSHIP TIME at 11:00 will be a brief opportunity to visit with others and eat a healthy snack.
- COURTYARD BELL will ring at 11:13 a.m. to indicate the start of Faith Formation Hour.
- FAITH FORMATION HOUR will include multiple offerings:
 - * Childcare for infants through Age 4
 - * Wondering Circle, a version of the Montessori-based "Godly Play" program, for Kindergarten thru 5th Grade
 - * "Sacraments Class" and "Introduction to the Bible" for Grades 4 & 5 (Spring)
 - * "Introduction to Meditation" for youth and adults
 - * "Church Chat" on various topics for youth and adults
 - * "Holy Troublemakers & Unconventional Saints" class for youth and adults
 - * Periodic Guest Speakers from the wider community

What can I do to make this a successful experiment for Community Church?

- Volunteer. Offer to lead a program or to assist the program leader.

Walk for Immigration Reform

On Monday, August 7th, I attended the final day of a 40-mile walk for immigration reform. It was organized by Northern California Coalition for Just Immigration Reform, which is made up of dozens of immigrant rights groups including ALMAS LIBRES, a Sonoma County organization of immigrant and Indigenous women. You might have seen coverage of the walk in the Press Democrat.

The walk took place in an effort to urge Congress to pass the HR 1511 Bill which would give the opportunity of citizenship to anyone who immigrated to the U.S. 7 years or more ago. This would change the documentation status of roughly eight million immigrants living in the U.S. today. The walk was 40 miles long, emphasizing the fact that it has been almost 40 years since there has been immigration reform in our country. It started on Saturday with one group walking from Petaluma and another from San Jose with the goal of meeting together in San Francisco at the Federal Building. I was only able to attend the final day, which consisted of walking through Sausalito, across the Golden Gate, and into the city. I walked 12.5 miles that day, and I was tired by the end of it, but I found it energizing and inspiring because there was a mix of people from organizations around the Bay Area ranging from the National TPS (Temporary Protected Status) Alliance to members of Sonoma's Commission on Human Rights.

Walking through Sausalito, it seemed like many business owners were skeptical while almost all workers were supportive. At one point a business owner was disgruntled by our group, but we could see the kitchen staff waving to us and cheering us on. Walking across the bridge and through the city, many people agreed with our goal. I first heard about the walk from the North Bay Organizing Project, and I felt compelled to go because of the number of people this bill has the potential to help and the quantity of difference it would bring for each one of them.



At Community Church of Sebastopol, we strive to create a safe environment for all. Our Safe Church Policy is posted on our web site, and you can also Click Here to read our Safe Church Policy.

In addition to requiring livescan background-checks, we also require that all staff and volunteers who work with children, youth, and vulnerable adults complete a Safe Church Policy Training, which must be renewed every 2 years. If you attended the Safe Church Policy Training last spring, you are good for now. But! If you are a volunteer with children or youth, and have not yet attended a Safe Church Policy Training, it's time!

Please choose one of the upcoming training dates: September 19, 6-8pm or October 1, 12:30-2:30pm. We'll be in the Media Room, and you're welcome to bring your own food to eat during the training.

There are also new laws in the State of California in effect, that require our staff and volunteers who work with children and youth to complete a Mandated Reporter Training module. This is about a 90-minute online course that can be completed on your own time. Our Leadership Council is in the process of pulling together a team to oversee the Mandated Reporter Training process. Please be on the lookout for more information about that!


