From the Pastor

In a recent sermon I mentioned a scientific "game" that demonstrates how difficult it is for us to notice something when we are expecting something else. It goes like this: You sit down at a table in front of an ordinary deck of cards. The scientist flashes six of them at you, asking you to identify them as fast as you can – nine of diamonds, three of hearts...oops! What was that last one? Then the exercise is repeated, more slowly, so that you can get the ones you missed the first time.

The third time is so slow that you think you must be an idiot because there is one card you simply cannot identify. You think you know what it is, but you are not sure. It is not until all the cards are laid face up on the table that you can see what the problem is. The mystery card is a six of spades, only it is red, not black. The deck has been fixed, thus preventing you from seeing what was there. You could not see a red spade because everyone knows that if a card is a spade, it is black. Your past experience and your expectations prevented you from seeing what was there. The red spade conflicted with your pre-set notions about how things are supposed to be.

Launch Sunday, 2013, will not only launch a new program year in our church, but will also launch us into a season of transition as Kristin reduces her time and gradually moves toward leaving her position here in 2014. It will be a time for reflection on our shared ministry – our strengths, our needs, our hopes and expectations for our church and a new minister.

But I hope we also remember that "fixed" card game. Will we be able to see the red spade? Which is to say, hopefully our memories, our experiences and our expectations will not blind us to what is really there – new openings for ministry, new possibilities, new ways of thinking about church,

I have heard it said that followers of Jesus Christ must be willing to be raised from the dead, be ready to receive new life, be prepared to be changed into something new. In these coming months of discernment, my prayer is that I – we – are open to all those possibilities. For it just might be that the restless and unpredictable Spirit in our midst does not choose to conform to our expectations. Watch for the red spade!




