

A-G, bring a side dish (chips & dip, baked beans, deviled eggs, vegetable tray... you get the idea!)


H-L, hors d'oeuvres and snacks to share while the band performs prior to lunch.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

After very positive financial news in April, the church took a bit of a step backwards financially in May. For the month, operating expenses exceeded revenues by \$1500, leaving us with a five month deficit of \$13,596. Actually pledge income has remained fairly consistent, but income has lagged in some other areas. And year to date expenses are only a couple of hundred dollars over projections.
