Markham grew up with Masai playmates, became famous as a breeder and trainer of race horses. She became even more famous as an aviatrix, the first woman to earn an aviator's license in Africa, later the first person to fly solo across the Atlantic from east to west.

West with the Night is a classic. Ernest Hemingway said she wrote so well, it made him ashamed of himself as a writer. The book is available at the library, at bookstores and on the web.

Precious Ramotswe opens a detective agency in Gabarone, Botswana. This is the first of a series of books about the *No. 1 Detective Agency*, stories set in present-day Africa.

### FINANCIAL UPDATE

The financial picture for January was a classic case of good news/bad news. It proved to be a strong month financially, with both pledge

and plate income exceeding projections. But it was also a month with high expenses as several quarterly payments were made. Our higher than usual administrative costs, all of which will even out over 12 months, means we finished the first month of the year with an operating deficit of \$6636. Expenses will drop in February, so hopefully it will be a month when we can cut into that deficit.

There is good news concerning operating pledges. As of mid-February, we have received 121 pledges totaling \$263,934. This means we have exceeded our pledge goal for 2012 by more than \$7000! Thank you for your faithful support of our church and its ministry.


