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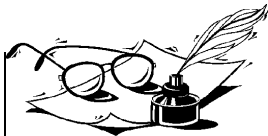
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From the Pastor

About a week before Christmas, I received an e-mail from a friend and former colleague. I say “former” because he retired from ministry shortly after Easter, 2012. He isn’t much older than I. When he told me his plans, I wondered if he would really go through with it, but retire he did...just as he said. He e-mailed from a train. He now lives in Ohio and he and his wife were taking a train from Cleveland to San Diego, where they will spend Christmas with relatives. Obviously he will no longer be worrying about Christmas Eve candlelight services...just how many acolytes do we still need?

It is interesting when long time friends begin retiring. I’m still just a kid...right? And when I look ahead to 2013 there is so much I am anticipating. I don’t have the time to retire! Our new building – Pilgrim Center – will soon be completed. Who knows, we might even put furniture in it! What will this wonderful new facility, including the beautiful outdoor courtyard, mean for our ministry, our outreach, for church growth and vitality? I can hardly wait to see! In the new year we will be exploring new possibilities for marketing our church, hopefully creating new revenue streams and higher visibility in our community as a church of “extravagant welcome.” We have to let the West County know that we are an alternative to the judgmental, narrow-minded, even mean-spirited Christianity that has been so prominent in the media in recent years.

In the new year, when construction is completed, I am hoping we can have a number of face-to-face discussions in our church about what comes next. Where are we going as a community of faith and where would we like to go? This could be a year to re-focus and re-prioritize. I also suspect it will be a year when financial challenges continue. As I write this, we still aren’t sure what our 2013 budget will finally look like. But even difficult budget discussions are an opportunity to think through our priorities.

What I want you to know is that I am energized as we enter this new year and I hope you are as well. Let us dare to believe, as you have heard me say before, that we have only just begun...that our best days are still ahead of us. And by God’s grace and guidance, that will be true.
