From the Pastor

Not long ago, a young boy showed up at church with his mother. He had been saving money and wanted to give the money to the church in order to help homeless people. Joyce Cox from our Mission & Outreach Board talked with him. He gave her \$150, again money he

had been saving, to help with our monthly lunches for the homeless. It brings a tear to my eye to tell this story even now. I think of small hands collecting and saving this money, and then gladly giving it away to help others. Kind of makes we wonder what I have done lately. In one incredibly generous and caring act, that child has said more about loving and reaching out to others than I could say in a hundred sermons. Could this be what Jesus meant when he spoke of our need to receive the Kingdom of God like a child?

We also recently had a wedding in the church, a couple, both in their fifties, who had never had a connection to our church. Why get married in The Community Church? Because two years ago they met each other, in Memorial Hall, on Thanksgiving Day, as they were volunteering at the annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner hosted by our church. When they decided to get married, they knew there was only one possible place for their wedding...the church where they met with a reception in Memorial Hall, the location of that fateful Thanksgiving dinner. Now I'm not sure that we can say in a brochure, "Volunteer for outreach and find a spouse!" but I find it very moving that, as they were reaching out and giving of themselves, they discovered each other.

I confess that I can often slip into despair about this unhappy country of ours - so much mean-spiritedness, selfishness, divisiveness, anger and fear. These often hurtful qualities have almost become an art form in Congress. But then a young child makes a generous, selfless gesture that takes my breath away; a couple finds each other as they are up their elbows in turkey gravy, reaching out and caring. And I realize...grace happens, hope happens, love happens. Maybe God hasn't given up on us yet. My spirit is renewed for another day. The Light still shines. Gene



FINANCIAL UPDATE

After many financial ups and downs, twists and turns, we actually finished 2013 with a positive balance of \$731in our

operating fund. Not a huge amount, but certainly better than a deficit. Once again our plate offering was very strong, finishing the year \$17,600 over expectations. Memorial Hall and our other facilities also generated strong income for our church. The disappointment was in our pledge income which finished \$19,000 under the pledge figure we anticipated based on the pledges of a year ago. Hopefully we will come closer to our pledge goal in 2014.

And speaking of our 2014 pledges, as of January 23, 2014, we have received pledges from 118 households with operating pledges totaling \$269,268. The good news is that this puts us of \$18,548 ahead of where we were at this time last year. As always, thank you for your great faithfulness.

COMMUNITY CHURCH OF SEBASTOPOL 125TH ANNIVERSARY-QUASQUICENTENNIAL

1889-2014

One of the most cherished shrines in America is that spot on the New England shore where our forefathers first knelt to give thanks to God for their deliverance from the dangers both physical and spiritual. In just such a way the early churches of each community in America have become shrines, not necessarily marked by stones, or columns, or plaques, but by the living, compelling affection in human hearts. The history of the old church is the foundation of the new, and each new church is built in memory and honor of the

old, thus becoming in itself a shrine to the past, and a living symbol of the future.

---from a brief history of The First Congregational Church of Sebastopol, by Josephine Darrow Duffield, historian, 1956

In the 1880s Congregationalists in and around the village of Sebastopol either went to the Green Valley Congregational Church or attended other churches. On July 26,1889, a group of Congregationalists met to take the necessary preliminary steps toward forming a church in Sebastopol. Nineteen people "signified their wish to unite in forming such church." Invitations were sent to neighboring churches to unite with the new church in council to be held in Barnes Hall on August 9, 1889, to recognize the church. Ministers from the Pacific Theological Seminary (Oakland) and the Petaluma and Santa Rosa Congregational Churches conducted the organizational service. The sermon was preached by Rev. J.K. Harrison from the Santa Rosa Congregational Church; he took II Kings 3:16-17 as his text. The congregation took up a collection and sang five hymns during the service: "Come Thou Almighty King", "Jesus Shall Reign", "Blest Be the Tie", "Laborers of Christ Arise", and "More Love to Thee".

News from the Search Committee

We are busy preparing for our search for a new Associate Minister who will have a focus on Children, Youth and Family ministry. Much of our work will be confidential when we are dealing with candidates so we want to let everyone know about the process as we begin. Below is a summary of the Search and Call process in the United



Church of Christ. Rev. Martha Williams came from the Conference to give us an orientation.

1. We have been hard at work developing a Job Description and Church Profile. We used information from the recent listening process and other gathered data. It has been an extensive process and we hope to be finished soon. It will then be available for you to look at in the church office.

2. Our vacancy will be listed in "UCC Employment Opportunities."

3. Persons who have been authorized to complete a UCC Ministerial Profile will submit profiles for our committee through the Conference office. The Ministerial Profile includes information about the candidate's educational background, experience, a detailed faith statement, eight written references, a background check form, and a criminal background check.

4. While the work on the Local Church Profile requires the input of many in the congregation, the names of candidates are held in strict confidence within our committee; we ask you to respect the essential confidentiality of this process. We will make every effort to keep you informed – on a regular basis – about our progress.

5. We will share our Local Church Profile with candidates, and we will begin to follow up with persons in whom we have particular interest. The follow up will include telephone reference checks, telephone interviews, and requests for sermon tapes. While pursuing these steps, we will also continue to evaluate new Ministerial Profiles.

6. We will select a small number of candidates for personal interviews, following which we will make arrangements continued...

for our Search Committee members to worship with them, most often in a church setting arranged by our Conference office.

7. We will invite at least two candidates back for second interviews, following which we will seek God's guidance and prayerfully make a decision on a candidate.

8. If the candidate we recommend chooses to accept, compensation arrangements will be clarified, and a date for a "Candidating Sunday" will be established.

9. You will have an opportunity to meet the candidate (and family) that weekend in an informal setting as well as the formal worship service where the candidate will preach. A congregational meeting following the worship service will offer each member an opportunity to ask questions of the Search Committee and to vote on the Call to our new associate pastor. We profoundly trust hat God will guide both our candidates and the members of our Search Committee. We ask you to pray for us regularly. With hard work and God's guidance we will hire an enthusiastic pastor who will minister to all of us, with a primary emphasis on our youth and young families. We are blessed to be part of this wonderful church community.



Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity Homes: There are 11 homes planned in 2014 for Cotati. The first five are in construction now, with all infrastructure almost completed.
