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

From the Pastor

It is January. A new year begins and in the church calendar, it is the season of Epiphany. Epiphany – the time when we celebrate the revealing of Christ as the Light to all the world. For us, this is symbolized in the journey of the Wise Men – gentiles, outsiders, seekers - who follow a light in order to find the Light.

Interestingly, one could argue that they made a mistake. They should have gone to Jerusalem in their quest. After all, it was the center of wealth and status and worldly power. If a new king was to be found, Jerusalem was the place. But they were about nine miles off. They ended up in Bethlehem – rural, dusty, unnoticed, unpretentious Bethlehem. Here they found the king they sought, far away from high towers, great arenas, big banks and urban achievements. As one author has said, the wise men “reorganized their wealth and learning, and reoriented themselves and their lives around a baby with no credentials.”

As we begin a new year together, we already know it will be a year of great change for our church. Our 125th year will be a year of transition as we bid Kristen a fond good-bye and prepare for a new staff member. And with Pilgrim Center now up and running, who knows what new opportunities for ministry and service will open before us? But as we journey together, I hope we can remember the unlikely path chosen by the wise men. Turning away from the expected path of power and wealth, security and prosperity, they instead went the way of vulnerability, neighborliness and generosity. They choose a more modest and risky future where spears are turned into pruning hooks and swords into plowshares.

When I look forward to the coming year, of course I hope for church growth, expanded use of our facilities, more and more children in our Sunday School and healthy funding of our many ministries. I want to let individuals and families know that this just might be the church for them. But I also hope that we remain open to taking a different path – that less-traveled path of service, caring, openness, generosity and extravagant welcome. Will we be successful, at least as the world measure success? Maybe...maybe not. But we will be faithful. And that just may be enough.




