From our Pastor

Once again we move into the season of Lent, that 40 day period – not counting Sundays – before the great celebration of Easter. I always find Lent to be a challenging season. And the challenge comes, not from the "usual" Lenten talk of sin, confession and penitence, not from the talk of "giving something up" for Lent, and not from the "bloody, bloody Jesus" hymns - Lizann Bassham's description of many of the Lenten hymns.

No, for me the challenge goes a bit deeper. I realize, perhaps in this season above all others, how completely I buy into the cultural assumptions of our time: that I am pretty much in charge of my own life; that my life is self-created through my own astute, free, deliberate choices – "I choose, therefore I am." In such a world I am the only one who knows what is right for me, what is true for me, what rules work for me. Don't bother me with your judgments because my opinion is the measure of all things. That may sound a bit extreme, but in my humble opinion it is not far from the cultural norm of 21st century America.

Then we find ourselves in Lent – old-fashioned, judgmental, countercultural Lent; a season that dares to suggest that perhaps I am not the center of the universe or the sole determiner of what is right and true. Lent proclaims that there is another claim on my life, another voice that needs to be heard, indeed that the will of God for us might be more important than the priorities of our own choosing.

How easily we are seduced by wealth. How easily we prioritize our comforts over the needs of others. Then we meet a young man on the road to Jerusalem who says simply, "Follow me." And that dangerous choice may be the only one that leads to true life.


ST. PATRICK'S DINNER Monday, March 17 in Memorial Hall 5:00 – 8 PM

ASH Wednesday

On Wednesday, March 5, we will mark the beginning of the season of Lent with two Ash Wednesday services in Faith Chapel.

A special Children's Service (adults are welcome too!) will be at 5:30 PM in the chapel. Then at 5:45 everyone is invited to a simple soup supper in Memorial Hall that will conclude by 6:30. At 6:45 PM a contemplative service for adults will be held in the chapel. Ashes will be available for those who would like to receive them as we start the 40 day journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and Holy Week.

Ash Wednesday

Q: What's happening for children on Ash Wednesday? Isn't that a time for adults?

A: Actually, we're glad you asked! Children enjoy participating in the change of church seasons, and Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. There will be a short and wonderful Ash Wednesday service for children and families on Wednesday, March 5th at 5:30pm in the Chapel. A simple soup supper follows at 5:45pm in Memorial Hall, with the adult service in Faith Chapel at 6:45pm. (You don't even have to cook dinner that night!)

Q: Isn't Ash Wednesday too depressing for children? What's going to happen in this service?

A: The service will not focus on the traditional language of sin and death that we might hear in a liturgy for adults. We will change the colors of the paraments (cloth) to purple. There will be a (very) short procession and the opportunity for parents and children to exchange ashes on their foreheads.

Q: What's for dinner afterwards?

A: There will be a simple soup dinner, with sandwiches and cut veggies for the children. It's a great chance to share a meal with the people coming to the later service too! You'll be ready to go and all set for your family bedtime routine by 6:30pm!
