From Our Pastor

Another Launch Sunday is before us; another program year in the life of our church is about to begin. This will be my 36th Launch Sunday at The Community Church. Who would have thought that, when I stood up to preach my first sermon here in June, 1978, I would still be preaching from that same pulpit in 2014? Certainly not me! As someone who often challenges others to dare to take great risks of faith, it would certainly seem that I have played it pretty safe. I wonder about that.

But then I think about the year ahead. As you read this, Lydia will have already joined our staff as our youth director, a path that will eventually see her called as our Associate Minister! For the school year, 2014-2015, Rachel will continue as our Christian Education director, which is certainly good news! And, in 2015, we will begin to plan for a fund-raising campaign, the goal of which will be to pay off the remaining loans on our new building – Pilgrim Center - which is also the center for the creative work of both Lydia and Rachel. And just the other day I was approached by a person wanting to tell me how much she appreciated our new Faith Chapel. Yes, undertaking that construction project was a great risk, but it is proving to be such a gift to our ministry and our wider community. And we have managed to reduce our debt to around \$380,000. That alone is quite an accomplishment.

These are just a few examples of the many ways our church seems to find to re-invent itself time and time again. Just think of how our music ministry has changed and grown, mission trips have evolved, use of our buildings has expanded, new leaders have emerged, and engagement with our wider community has deepened. Yes, I have stayed in the same place, but it seems like I have been the pastor of several different congregations over the years. The “same old, same old,” just has never seemed to suit us very well. As much as I might have wanted to, you have never allowed me to play it safe.

We are looking ahead to a year with new staff, new families, new people with new ideas. And even after all these years, I eagerly look forward to being a part of it all. I think I will take another look at the Dr. Suess’ book, *Think of the Places You’ll See*. It is not a bad description of our shared ministry. So yes, I am excited to share another Launch Sunday with you. And I hope you are excited. When September 7th rolls around, I can’t think of any other place I would rather be than right here, with all of you.

WE DID IT!



125TH ANNIVERSARY-QUASQUICENTENNIAL

1889-2014

The Rev. Peter Jansen served The First Congregational Church of Sebastopol from 1961-1969. On April 23, 1961 the church voted to affiliate with the United Church of Christ – a new denomination resulting from the merger of the Congregational/Christian and Evangelical/Reformed denominations. On June 4, 1961, Rev. Jansen led the first worship service and Service of Dedication in the newly completed Fellowship Hall. The 75th Anniversary of the church was held on September 13, 1964.



On November 19, 1967, Rev. Jansen led the dedication service for the new sanctuary.

The following letter is from the 1964 Seventy-Fifth Anniversary Church Directory.


From the Clergy:

FINANCIAL UPDATE

It is good to report that the financial situation of our church improved significantly during the month of July.

Thanks to a significant increase in pledge income we were able to finish the month with our operating fund \$5,278 in the black! Quite a turnaround from the situation at the end of June when we were \$20,500 in the red. Thanks to all of you who responded so faithfully during the month. Unfortunately, our plate income continues to lag behind our projections and our facility use fees are lower than anticipated. But those fees should pick up again in the Fall. With a new staff member coming on board and the usual fall program costs, finances will remain a challenge. But the picture certainly has gotten much more encouraging.




MEMORIAL HALL KITCHEN UPDATE




