#### From the Pastor

Recently I came across an article with the interesting title, "Are Sundays Dying?" The author, Ryan Jacob, cited Canadian survey data which indicated that even on Sunday, the last citadel of rest and renewal, religious observances, socializing, eating at home and even sleep had all declined over a 25 year period. And during the same period, the time spent working on Sunday had increased dramatically. It makes me wonder if we are in the midst of a major attack on leisure and rest. Says Lutheran pastor, Benjamin J. Dueholm, "The war on leisure, after all, extends beyond Sundays. Commerce and work, and the political power that gathers around them, are eroding the concept of Sabbath – of divinely ordained rest – in every aspect of life. The erosion of idleness is active just below the surface of many of our policy debates over work, family and retirement."

For some reason, blaming the poor for their plight seems to be a popular spectator sport these days, even as those same voices resist any increase in the minimum wage. But a majority of these workers have families and are working more than full time just to make ends meet. How can we speak of family values when we pursue wage and benefit policies that keep workers from being with their families? Raul Meza, a Los Angeles school custodian who works more than one job, said this about his wages: "When I think of making \$15 an hour, I think mostly of the time that money would buy with my son." Is human life meant only to serve labor markets and fuel economic growth? Or do we need to consider the possibility, supported by the biblical concept of Sabbath, that life is valuable in itself – is its own rationale and form of wealth. Could it be that each of us, even the poorest of the poor, is created to be more than simply a beast of burden?

For over 30 years, I have used the June newsletter, right on the edge of summer, to talk about the importance of Sabbath and leisure. And at the heart of Sabbath is the drastic, unyielding, world shaking, market unfriendly claim that life – all of life – is in some sense its own end and not an instrument to be used for other, often economic, purposes. The great Jewish writer and theologian, Abraham Heschel, referred to the Sabbath as "a day for the sake of life, a palace in time, an outpost in the rest of life." My hope is that, in the coming season, we can defend this outpost, not only for ourselves and our families, but for all families. Let us be the ones who dare to say "NO!", who dare to embody a counter-culture alternative, to all the jealous and false ideologies of modern life.

# FINANCIAL UPDATE After a very positive month financially

After a very positive month financially in March, the financial news for the church was not so good in April. Our spending exceeded operating receipts

by \$8000, meaning we finished the month with an operating deficit of \$16,665. Not a great way to begin the summer months. Pledge income was significantly down, leaving us \$3200 below our budget projections. Plate income and income from facilities use were also below projections. Good news is that expenses from the operating fund remain over \$3000 below projections, but this has not been able to offset our lower than expected income. Hopefully May can be a bounce-back month.

#### IN TRANSITION... OUR NEXT STEPS

The Transition Committee has met now three times, including an hour-long meeting by phone with Drew Nettinga, the associate Conference Minister.

While the scope of our assignment is to look at ALL issues as they might relate to the transition process, our initial focus is on identifying a plan and general timeline for the next year that we can present to the Church Council. Our starting point is Gene's retirement at the end of April 2016, and we work the plan back from that date.

The First Congregational Church of Berkeley is in a similar transition process with the retirement of their long-time minister. They are in the final selection phase, so they are some months ahead of us and can serve as a valuable model for our planning process. We continue our research this week with committee members talking with folks from the First Berkeley church about their process and lessons learned.

We expect to bring a proposal to the May 27th Church Council meeting outlining a general plan and timeline for the coming year. Our recommendation to the Council will be to accept the proposal at the May meeting, and then spend the next few weeks presenting it to the congregation for review and discussion. We would make adjusts to the plan as needed based on input during this period and then ask the Church Council for final approval at the June meeting. 

Rachel Knuth, our Children's Program Director, will work her final Sunday on June 7 and then return to us on August 23. Her position as Children's Program Director was designed to cover from late August for preparations for Launch Sunday, through the Sunday School year. Although we will see Rachel and her family for Sunday worship, please be respectful of the fact that she is

currently not on staff. Over the summer, the Children's Messages will be presented by Lydia, Gene and Brian.

Our UCC Golden Gate Association and the Conference have already approved Rachel's position for ordination pending call. As this newsletter goes to print, a Letter of Call has been prepared for Rachel, calling her as Minister of Children and Families for our church.

On May 31 a congregational meeting will be held following worship for the purpose of calling Rachel as our Minister of Children and Families. If Rachel receives a positive vote, we will move toward an ordination service on Sunday, August 30<sup>th</sup>.

So when Rachel returns in the fall to our staff, it is very likely she will return as an ordained minister and would continue in her current position – 15 hours a week.

Lydia Mulkey, our Youth Director, graduated from Pacific School of Religion on May 24th. Following graduation, Lydia will be working more hours at the church in June and July and she will also lead our Senior Mission Trip to Georgia from June 20th to 27th, work with Rachel in planning and leading our summer children's MADD camp from July 6th to 10th, and will serve as Chaplain at the Senior High Camp at Cazadero from July 12th to 18th.

Beginning on August 10th, she will start a three-month Clinical Pastoral Care program at Kaiser Permanente Hospital in Vallejo. This will occupy most of her time during the week, so during those months, she will be in Sebastopol on Sundays only. She will continue to participate in worship and provide leadership to our junior and senior high programs. This clinical program is a requirement she must fulfill in order to be ordained.

When the clinical program is completed, Lydia will begin the final steps toward ordination, which hopefully will happen early in 2016, in the Southern California Conference of the UCC, where her home church is located. Thus, looking ahead to 2016, the plan is to prepare a letter of call, have a congregational meeting and "officially" call Lydia as the Associate Pastor of The Community Church. We would then proceed with a service of installation in our church.

Thus, early in 2016 we could have two talented, newly ordained ministers on our church staff!
