Beginning Our Ministry Together REV. DR. BENJAMIN J. BROADBENT

First of all, I want to thank you for the tremendous welcome you extended to my family and me during the candidating weekend. It is a trying process, but your warmth and interest and engagement confirmed our decision to respond to God's prompting words, "Check out Sebastopol."

Secondly, I want to acknowledge that this change for both of us - pastor and congregation - is at once full of exciting possibilities and tinted with grief as you continue to let go of your beloved pastor of 38 years and as my family and I let go of the community that nurtured us for the past 17. We will all need a lot of grace, grace that which we can offer each other as well as the Grace which only God can give.

Thirdly, I am very much looking forward to being with you and beginning to create new patterns of ministry as pastor and congregation. I'm interested in how our liturgical life will develop as the traditions of your congregation and my own proclivities meet and co-create new forms. I'm interested to learn what is near and dear to you so that we can build upon it, and I'm interested to know what it is you are ready to change and/or develop. I'm interested in learning how The Community Church of Sebastopol has impacted the wider culture and how we might continue to do so in the coming years.

Finally, you should know that, while I find much enjoyment in ministry, I don't approach ministry casually. I think the work of the church is life or death work both for members of the congregation and for the wider community. I believe God calls the church to practice and bear witness to the Way of Jesus. With Jesus, the church embodies bold justice. risky compassion, and radical inclusion – in other words, deep love of God and adventurous love of neighbor.

As you may imagine, there is still much for me, my wife Brooke, and our kids, Marin and Sophia, to do over the next couple of months to prepare to arrive in Sebastopol. During that time, we covet your prayers, knowing it will not be easy. And we will pray for you in this in-between time, knowing that it, too, will not be easy. But let us trust that, together, we are bearing the yoke of Christ, which is easy, and the burden of Christ, which is light. Easy because we do not bear it alone - Christ bears it with us - and light because it is the true source of our joy - life in, with, and through our living and loving God.

Until August, I send you my anticipatory love and affection.

The Pastoral Search Committee is thrilled to announce that we have a new Senior Minister! The Rev. Dr. Benjamin J. Broadbent and his family came for a busy candidate weekend filled with meals, meetings and a wonderful worship service May 7 & 8 where he gave the children's message, prayed and preached. At a congregational meeting immediately following the service he was elected by an overwhelming majority of 166 out of 168 votes.



He signed an official Letter of Call and will begin his ministry with us in early August.

Pastor Benjamin or "Ben" comes to us with his wife Brooke Bell and their son, Marin (10), and daughter, Sophia (7), from

Colorado Springs, Colorado, where he has served for 17 years at The First Congregational Church. They are happy to return to Northern California – Ben grew up in Santa Cruz and Brooke is from San Jose.

Ben and Brooke have a sweet connection to our church – they met for the first time in our Pilgrim House in 1997, at a meeting of counselors for Camp Caz! He and Brooke reconnected with many former Caz friends at the dinner on May 7 and on Sunday. They are looking forward to our famous Apple Pie Event and bringing their kids to our Family Camp this September.

Benjamin outshone all the other people applying for the position and was a unanimous choice by the search committee. We have felt strongly since November that he is an excellent fit for our church. He earned his Master of Divinity from Harvard Divinity School in 1998. In 1999, he became the Associate Minister of Children, Youth and Families at First Congregational Church in Colorado Springs. In 2005, he was called as the Lead Minister

of his church when the Senior Minister retired. Ben received his Doctor of Ministry in Preaching from the Chicago Theological Seminary in 2012, writing a dissertation on Preaching as an Embodied Practice. 
TAKE ME OUT TO THE BALLGAME!

SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE HOMELESS BY THE COMMUNITY CHURCH OF SEBASTOPOL

As the homeless population in Sebastopol has grown, so has the involvement of our church in serving our neighbors in need. An average of 15 requests for help are received each week.

In 2015 the Community Church provided:

- \circ 1,426 showers, with a clean towel, soap and shampoo
- o 480 loads of clean laundry
- o 800 bus rides to folks without transportation
- 107 shoeboxes filled with toiletries and personal necessities of life
- o 150 pairs of socks provided to homeless men
- Nearly 1,000 snack bags distributed
- 120 hot meals served at our 2nd Saturday Lunch

For more than a year the Community Church has participated in the Safe Parking Program. Currently we are hosting 5 families, each vetted and selected by the Catholic Charities Homeless Services Center. They arrive in our parking lot in the evening and leave each morning by 7 am.

Many thanks to everyone who has helped in the Sunday School this school year, both as storytellers and as art helpers! The children have heard beautiful stories and created amazing art responses to those stories, and we are all grateful for the adults who have held this group of children with care all year long.

Thanks also to the faithful Christian Education Committee, which works behind the scenes--praying for our children and their families, supporting children's programming, and thinking theologically about our children's ministry.
