A Baptism-shaped Life

Rev. Benjamin Broadbent

In his book "Fear of the Other," Will Willimon wonders about the ways in which humans divide ourselves into we and they, neighbor and stranger, friend and enemy. Do we stress our individual identities to the point of overstressing our uniqueness? "While we are so proudly asserting that 'I am me," Willimon writes, "Christians must also stress that my signifiers like class, gender, tribe, race, and history are being reframed and reinterpreted by the infinitely more determinative qualifier – baptized."

I caught my breath when I read that last word. Is baptism really that important, that determinative? In early January each year, the church remembers the story of Jesus' baptism, which prefigures our own baptism. In baptism, we are symbolically put to death and raised to new life. Cultural signifiers we use to justify "us over them" are washed off in the waters of baptism. On the other side of baptism, we belong to a humanity that has fallen short of the glory of God, and yet a humanity which God loves enough to save. How does God save?

- By creating humans in God's own image
- By sending prophets to bring warnings and to show a way out of no way
- By incarnating in the birth of Jesus
- By entering the waters of baptism
- By becoming vulnerable to death on a cross
- By rising from the grave on the third day
- By sending the Holy Spirit and hovering over our every day so that we might live a Baptism-shaped life

If you remember one thing throughout 2017, remember this: baptized, we are not who the wider culture wants to say we are. We are who God says we are, along with our brother Jesus: "Beloved, in whom I am well pleased."
