#### **Resurrection as Uprising**

by Rev. Benjamin Broadbent, Senior Minister

This year Lent began on Lover's Day, February 14, and ends at sunrise on Fool's Day, April 1. "God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom," Paul observes, "and God's weakness is stronger than human strength." When we open our eyes on April 1 this year, we will wake up again to the reality of resurrection.

In "We Make the Road by Walking," Brian McLaren observes that "God's word doesn't come in dominating, crushing force. It comes only in vulnerability, in weakness, in gentleness." God communicates love for humanity through Christ's death on a cross. Betrayed by followers, denied by friends, ridiculed by authorities, he died a death he did not deserve and experienced the full weight of human separation from God.

But three days later, women disciples went to the tomb with spices to anoint Jesus' body. What they found was beyond their expectation and comprehension. An empty tomb. Discarded burial cloths. Angelic visitors. Appearances. Resurrection. The crucified one had been raised from the dead and was now at loose in the world. "An uprising of hope, not hate. An uprising of love, not weapons... a joyful promise of life and peace." When we rise from our beds on Easter morning, we rise into a world of life overcoming death. God's foolishness at work. In us.

- Will you strive to deepen your understanding of what it means to follow Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior? "I will, relying on the Holy Spirit."
- Will you attempt, by the grace of God, to follow in the way of Jesus as his disciple, to resist oppression and violence, to show love and justice, and to embody the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able? "I will, with the help of God."
- As a member of the church of Jesus Christ, do you intend to grow in the Christian faith, joining in the dynamic movement of God's people in this local congregation and as part of the global church by sharing in its joys and sorrows, listening to and learning from people older and younger, and by sharing your own gifts and perspectives so that together we may celebrate Christ's presence and serve this community and the world in Christ's name? "I do, by God's grace."

# Transition Process to new Governance Model and Revised Bylaws Why, How, What and When?

Our current bylaws have been in place since 1985 and in many ways have served us very well. However, in recent years, we have become aware that our current practices are not adequately reflected by these bylaws and that many aspects of them might more appropriately belong in a Policy Book. We also realized that several processes as currently defined are redundant and that an increasing amount of energy is put into getting people to fill committees rather than to carry out ministry.

As a result, beginning over a year ago, initial conversations led to the formation of a Council Subcommittee on Governance which discussed multiple approaches and eventually focused on a Governance Model which we believed was the best approach for us to pursue our future objectives. Over the course of 2017, Council held an offsite retreat to more fully explore the proposed model. The decision was made to move ahead with this model. Multiple sessions were held throughout the year to help everyone understand the new model and to answer any questions that might have arisen. Additionally, the model was presented at the Annual Meeting on January 28<sup>th</sup> of this year.

The revision of our current bylaws enables the new governance model and provides the flexibility and transparency that we all felt was essential as we move forward. The first draft of those bylaws is now complete and available for you to review. Copies can be found online, in the narthex and in the Church office. We will be holding the first of two planned feedback sessions on Sunday, February 18<sup>th</sup> at noon in the Media Room. The Transition Committee will incorporate your comments and suggestions wherever possible into the next draft. A second feedback session will be held on Sunday, March 18<sup>th</sup> at noon in the Media Room. Once again, your input will be utilized whenever possible.

After this second feedback session, a final draft will be presented for approval by Council prior to our Special Congregational Meeting on April 15<sup>th</sup>. At that point, everyone will have had multiple opportunities continued

to offer their comments and the meeting process will be a simple yes/no vote on incorporation of the revised bylaws. Members of the Governance Subcommittee will be happy to provide you with additional information: Pastor Broadbent, Nancy Shimetz, Patty Raney, Mike Ott, Chris Dawson, Marge Holland, Judy Rice.

Those of us who have worked on the new governance model and the revised bylaws are excited about the opportunities it provides and especially grateful that our congregation has been able to be an active participant in the entire process.


