FROM THE PASTOR... EPIPHANY NEWNESS

Epiphany is a season of newness. A new year. A story of strange sages with odd gifts following a star. Stories of Jesus' baptism, the beginning of his ministry, the call of new disciples. During Epiphany, the church sings along with St. John of the Apocalypse, "Behold! I am making all things new."

Along with the newness of the year and the newness of the season, Community Church will experience changes to our pastoral team with the departure of Rev. Rachel Knuth as our Associate Minister for Children and Families at the end of January. It is still my hope that pledged offerings will allow us to retain Pastor Rachel in a new part-time role, Pastor of Congregational Care. In the meantime, we have commissioned a committee to begin the process of searching for a new full-time Associate Minister for Faith Formation. Julie Reimer, a church member who brings several years of experience working with children's programs will become our Children's Ministry Coordinator until our new Associate Minister arrives.

But before we move on, I want to observe what Pastor Rachel has brought to our congregation over the past four years. Under her leadership, we now have a robust ministry for children and their families. Her Children's Messages are thoughtful, inclusive, and insightful. The Godly Play program she nurtured is one of the best in the region. We now offer a life-saving comprehensive sexuality education program for children and teens. Pastor Rachel's monthly preaching has inspired and challenged us as a congregation to connect our tentative faith with the real needs of the world.

As Pastor Rachel makes this transition, and we along with her, I want to express my gratitude for a pastoral colleague who has been supportive, collaborative, creative, and courageous. Thank you, Rachel, for making me a better pastor and us a better, more faithful congregation.

Middle School SALT Trip:

Food Justice around the Bay Area

Over Memorial Day weekend, the middle schoolers will go on a Food Justice Tour around the SF Bay Area and learn about environmental justice, environmental racism, and the impacts of not having access to healthy foods. They will then engage with communities surrounding the Bay area by helping out in community gardens and farms (i.e. Richmond at Happy Lots Garden and Farm and community gardens in West Oakland and San Francisco), all the while learning how to build community through land restoration! Partnering with Re-Member and the Oglala Lakota Tribe

Pine Ridge Reservation, South Dakota is the poorest county in the United States and the community that Remember partners with and serves. Re-member brings more than 1,200 volunteers to Pine Ridge each year for week-long service-learning trips, with an emphasis on cultural exchange. Working with our staff, you will help with various projects (i.e. making and delivering bunkbeds, improving accessibility and liveability of homes, skirting trailers, constructing outhouses, and working in a community garden in partnership with Re-member and the Oglala Lakota Tribe) across the reservation while learning about the culture and history of the Lakota people.

LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

The Leadership Council met on November 28. A summary of our discussion and action topics are described below.

<u>Financial Reports</u>: 2018 monthly financial information was reviewed and the current finances are healthy. 2018 pledges are on target and expenses have been lower than projected. In addition, facility use income is up.

<u>Pledge Drive</u>: As of November 25, the church had received \$315,468 in Local Ministry pledges and \$34,216 in Wider Mission pledges. The goal for Local Ministry for 2019 is \$369,000 and \$41,000 for Wider Mission. The Council authorized emailing to the 20 households that pledged last year but haven't pledged yet for 2019. The Budget Committee is reviewing several possible adjustments that could help balance the 2019 budget. These options include reducing the Associate Minister for Faith Formation package in 2019 from 6 months to 5 months, reducing Pastor Rachel's time by 5 hours per week and having church volunteers take over the landscaping of the campus. The various possibilities would help reduce the budget gap by approximately \$25,000. There may be a surplus of funds from the 2018 budget that could be allocated towards the 2019 budget. We all need to continue to cultivate givers in the congregation, to keep inviting participation to support our church!

<u>Associate Minister for Faith Formation Search Committee</u>: The committee was blessed and commissioned on December 9 by Pastor Benjamin. The committee is starting to meet regularly and will have a church profile, the document about our church that will be posted on the national UCC website for candidates to review, by the end of February. The committee will then begin receiving applications (profiles) from candidates.

<u>Articles of Incorporation</u>: The Articles of Incorporation are being reviewed and changed as necessary to align with our current by-laws.

<u>Pictorial Directory</u>: The Council plans to create a pictorial directory in 2019. More information on the directory will be coming soon.

Annual Meeting: The annual meeting will be January 27, 2019, after church. Plans are underway for a potluck luncheon that day.

<u>Facilities</u>: The Council approved the contract to replace the floors in the bathrooms and hallway of Memorial Hall. This work is now proceeding. There is a new microwave on order for the Memorial Hall kitchen. Options for solar panels on our campus are being explored. Composting is underway on campus from landscaping debris. The Safety and Security Team will be performing regular service inspections of the new AED kits on campus. Training in the use of the AED kits will be scheduled.

<u>Faith Formation</u>: Gail Thomas is stepping away from her service as faith journey coordinator, long-standing adult bible study leader, sanctuary flower coordinator, and more at the end of 2019. There will be a need to replace her.

Julie Reimer will be the new Children's Ministry Coordinator.

<u>New Council Member</u>: Linda Roa has replaced Becca Emerson (our new Congregational Administrator) as the Council's Member for Worship and Arts. The Council looks forward to her contributions!

FIRE RELIEF

I was privileged to bring a \$1900 check from our Mission and Outreach Committee to Reverend Jim Peck of the New Vision UCC Church in Chico who is hosting evacuees in his church office. These members of the Paradise community lost their homes, including a survivor who has ALS, is bed bound, and needs 24 hour care. Fortunately, his care providers were able to urgently hoist him into his chair and transport him and his mechanical bed to Chico. With no where to go, the care provider called Reverend Peck and the Reverend immediately welcomed them in. Clearly, this is a temporary setting for them and they're looking for other long-term housing options. When I handed the check to the Reverend, he literally teared up with immense appreciation. He will be using the funds to provide necessary support for these evacuees, who are not even members of his

church. I also spent some time providing them with Crisis Counseling, something I do in Sonoma County for fire survivors.



SHOE BOXES AND GIFT CARDS

SAFE PARKING PROGRAM UPDATE

The Community Church in conjunction with the First United Methodist Church of Santa Rosa, Catholic Charities and the County of Sonoma provides three parking spaces for individuals and families that have no other safe alternatives to spend the night. As of today – the allocated spaces are occupied from approximately 8:00pm to 7:00am.

Individuals wishing to find safe parking go through an intake process with Catholic Charities. In the case of the Community Church, they are then referred to the First United Methodist Church which then inquires whether we have space. If the answer is yes, we then meet with the potential parker and if accepted, we notify the relevant parties. At night, Safe Parkers place an authorization notice on one of their car windows. Currently parking on our site are, Marlene (Green Volvo wagon), Jeff (white Honda Accord sedan), Marisol and Robert (Mercury SUV).



Community Church volunteers provide monitoring of the site to make sure the parkers are safe by driving through the parking lot one time during the night and if possible, in the morning. Volunteers are on call if there are any issues. Any calls from parkers are routed through a Google Voice number. Right now, we have 5 volunteers that each take one night. Gary Bachelor and Mike Ott fill in on the weekends. We are always looking for additional help.
