simple graphics, we see how, as the artist says, the "loving arms of the Gardener reach out to provide us everything we need." I appreciate the tattoo-looking arms and the simple use of color, just a bit of gold-but it's underground, shining from the roots. Rev. Pittman says she created the sleeves to show all the things a plant needs, not just to survive, but to thrive. In the sleeves I see sun, rain, earth, water. But I also see a bit of adversity in the rock- and I'm learning that actually a wee bit of challenge makes a plant stronger. At our house, when we planted fruit trees last year, they seemed so spindly and small. But the wind actually nudged them to strengthen up their trunks a bit. (I know some of my children will be in college or beyond, before these new trees bear fruit– but I'm banking on nectarines with grandchildren!). The small bit of adversity now will be strength for the fruit-bearing years of the future.

Lent is a season when we are invited by our scriptures and rhythm of the church year to sink our hands and hearts into deeper soil and experience what's underground. It's a time when we might examine our own roots and consider how to provide nurture for our faith to continue to grow– for our individual paths, and for our church community. It may be a time of confession, of releasing (or "giving up") what holds us back from our relationship with God. It may also be a time of rooting ourselves down and saying yes to that internal, underground growth that will support us in the seasons to come.

And to do this, to grow in faith, we need stories. Human beings for all time have been hungry for stories. We long to hear what happened to those who have gone before us-how they encountered suffering, and how God came alongside them in it. We have a need to tell our stories to each other- and this requires brave storytellers and generous listeners, both. The late writer, William Kittredge, once wrote, "What we need most urgently is a fresh dream of who we are that will tell us how we should act... stories that tell us to stay humane amid our confusions... We need stories that will encourage us to understand that we are part of everything,

that the world exists under our skins, and that destroying it is a way of killing ourselves. Our lilacs bloom, and buzz with honeybees and hummingbirds. We can still find ways to live in some approximation of heaven." I think part of what he's saying here is that stories ground us and help us grow.

As we embark on our Lenten journey together, it's a time of deep storytelling. Our scriptures will lead us to listen for God's story unfolding over the aeons- stories of God's faithfulness in desert places and parables of frustration. Through it all, God provides- filling God's people to the brim. Our Lenten practices will also support us. There will be a number of opportunities this Lent for each of us to sink deeper in our own livesfrom a "Good Enough Lent Group" to establishing a prayer practice at our evening meals at home, to a "Faith Journey Cafe" evening of storytelling and community. This Lent, I invite you to choose at least one of our Lenten programs-choose one that will fill you to the brim, so you are ready when God calls you to be poured out in love in another season. Or maybe at least, choose the practices this Lent that will make you full "enough" to the brim. I look forward to the lengthening of days, the strengthening of capacity, the listening and telling of holy stories- and how through it all, we will continue to grow, together.®



Full to the Brim: Special Programs for Lent by Pastor Rachel

This Lenten season we have several opportunities for our whole church to deepen connection with God and each other in community. Psalm 118:5 says, "I cried out to God in my narrowness, and God answered with great expanse." This Lent you are invited to live into God's great expanse, in whatever ways bring you closer to God. Here are some great options:

Create a home altar to guide your prayer life using symbols of life, death, and resurrection (from the all-church Nature Hike, or objects you find at home)

Whether you joined the all-church Nature Hike, or not, find three nature objects around your home, to be symbols of life, death, and resurrection. Once settled at home with your three objects, place them on your dining table, to pray with at meal time throughout Lent. Your evening mealtime prayers during Lent might look something like this:

(Holding your symbol of life): God, today I noticed you when... (Holding your symbol of death): God, today I confess that I turned away from you when...

(Holding your symbol of resurrection): God, today I thank you for showing me new life when... Amen.
