



Dear CommChu Friends,

By the time you receive this "postcard," I will be very close to returning from my trip to "sabbatical-land" where I have been since February 1. I wanted to take some time to

tell you what I've seen and done and experienced while here.



As you may recall, the focus of the sabbatical was to "develop a writing practice." Well, I'm happy to report it happened! Here's what I did:

- First thing each morning I wrote morning pages, 3 pages of stream-of-thought writing. I filled two composition books over the course of 3 months.
- I kept a poetry journal that I took with me wherever I went so that when an idea came to mind, I wrote it down. Sometimes I would sit, or stand, depending on the circumstances, and write out a whole poem.
- I created a website with a blog: www.benjaminbroadbent.com. Nearly every day I posted something and then shared the link via Facebook so others could read what I was writing. Sometimes I posted a poem, other times a memory or a devotional piece. I appreciate all who read the posts, "liked" them (even if you didn't actually like them), and left comments.
- I took an online writing course with Natalie Goldberg called "Writing Down the

Bones: Find Your Voice, Tell Your Story." It was very well done and included pre-recorded talks, writing exercises and live interactions with the instructor and other writers taking the course, many of whom participated from across the globe.

• I will finish the sabbatical with a retreat at Ghost Ranch in Abiquiu, New Mexico called "Writing from Antiquity." I'm looking forward to hiking in the desert and writing in the presence of Georgia O'Keefe and her beloved landscape.

I did some other things while on sabbatical, many of them beautifully mundane, the kinds of things I could do any day but don't, usually because it takes too much mental energy to step out of the inertia of my regular routines:

- * Went on a different Sonoma County hike each week, including Tolay Lake, Crane Creek, Taylor Mountain, Foothills, Helen Putnam, and Shiloh Regional Parks.
- * Made breakfast for my kids once a week. Normally we are an every morning cereal and fruit family, but it's nice to have waffles and sausage now and then.
- * Went on a date with Brooke multiple times each month, including a return to Calistoga where we got engaged in 1999.
- * Took care of some house projects like grinding the bumps out of our sidewalk. I had to learn how to use an angle grinder with a diamond cup wheel.
- * Visited a different church each week, including Hessel Church, St. Stephen's Episcopal, the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Santa Rosa, Thrive Church, Wellspring UCC, Alfred Street Baptist Church, Community Baptist Church, and Church of the Incarnation.
- * Got reconnected and reacquainted with friends I've known for a long time. I was even able to go down to Santa Cruz to celebrate the 50th birthday of my best and longest friend.

I hope this gives you a flavor of how I spent the time. I also took some glorious walks and naps, didn't check email, and otherwise took seriously God's command to observe a Sabbath and rest.

I am filled with gratitude for this congregation, for its investment in me and my ministry, for granting me this sabbatical and trusting that it will be beneficial for our mutual ministry. I am particularly grateful to the volunteers who stepped into leadership positions during these three months, to the guest preachers who brought fresh words to our pulpit, and to Rev. Rachel Knuth for her faithful, adept, and grounded leadership as Acting Lead Minister.

I'm looking forward to being back with you all. I have renewed energy, some fresh ideas, and a clearer sense of who I am as a pastor and a person. Together we have a lot of good work to do. It will be challenging and adventurous, but also energizing and hope-filled. Upon my return, I will be asking how you are responding to your longing for a more real relationship with God and what part of the ministry of Christ's church you can see yourself drawing energy from.
