### Minutes of the 127th Annual Meeting

The Community Church of Sebastopol - January 22, 2017

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Joyce Cox.

Pastor Benjamin led an opening prayer. He then commemorated with a prayer and a soft bell-tone members who have passed on in 2016. They were: Fran Begun, Natalie Belew, Mel Davis, Vince DaLuiso, Darryl Fenley, Carole Hudlow, Tom Larssen, and Lorna Skinner.

The minutes of the 126th annual meeting were approved.

The annual reports were presented and approved.

### 2016 Financial Report and Proposed 2017 Budget

John Henel reviewed the 2106 financial report and the proposed 2017 budget. He stated "2016 was quite a year!" We ended the year with a surplus of than more \$30,000 and paid off the building fund. Expenses were down and more pledges were fulfilled. He then explained that the surplus would be saved as a "rainy day fund" and the 2017 budget would begin with a zero balance. Pledges for 2017 are over \$300,000 for the first time.

He then reviewed the budget for 2017. The process started in September and the committee met every two weeks. It was presented to and approved by Council on Jan. 11, and a preview offered to the Congregation Jan. 15. He explained that the budget is an expression of our goals and values, and an expression of our ministry to each other and the wider community. Because the Annual Appeal was so successful, they were able to fund all programs and expand others. He also explained that the budget format had been changed for more clarity. John then answered questions and concerns.

John then thanked the Budget Committee (Kathy Bell, Ben Broadbent, John Henel and Dan Rasmus), Bobbie Johanson and the Building Committee, and the Gratitude and Generosity Committee for all of their time and efforts in 2016.

**Nominating Committee Report**: The following were added to the report: Adult Ed., Judy Rice; C.E., Brooke Bell; M&E, Terry Beck; Personnel, Kathy Bell; and Youth, Stuart Mitchell; M&O, Susan Nestor.

Installation of Leaders for 2017: Pastor Ben then installed the leaders for 2017.

**Acknowledgement of Joyce Cox, 2016 Moderator**: Pastor Ben acknowledged Joyce Cox for her leadership during 2016 and presented her with a gift of appreciation.

**New Moderator for 2017**: Joyce then passed the gavel to Patty Rainy, the Moderator for 2017.


Pastor Rachel Knuth led the benediction and the meeting was adjourned.



### Senior Minister 2017 Annual Report

### The Accordion Rule

Looking back upon the year, it seems like time has flown. On the other hand, it was a full year, and it amazes me how much happened. It makes me think of an accordion – closed it is small, but open it doubles or triples in size.

### Highlights of 2017:

- January 22 12 people joined the church, including 3 adults who were baptized.
   Experienced my first Annual Meeting of the Congregation as your Senior Minister.
- March 11 Planned and led leadership Event for Board and Committee Chairs, staff team members, and key volunteers to explore our role as leaders as the church responds and adapts to the future
- April 5 Council formed Governance Sub-Committee to explore new governance models for the church.
- April 14 Preached sermon at Ecumenical Good Friday service, hosted at St.
   Stephen's Episcopal by Rev. Christy Laborda-Harris.
- o May 26 Led Middle School Mission Trip to San Jose with Antonio Trevino.
- June 3 Officiated off-site at the wedding of Keri Wessling and Jeff Garrison, my first since returning to California.
- June 10 Officiate my first wedding in our sanctuary Rosi Banuve & Mosese Luveniyali, and learned that Tala Tala is pastor in Fijian.
- June 15-18 Attended Annual Gathering of the Northern California Nevada Conference at Sonoma State University in Rohnert Park with Pastor Rachel, Patty Raney, and Marian McDonald.
- July 16-22 Served as Chaplain at Junior Camp at Cazadero with Kathy Bell and Debbie McCallum as Directors. My daughter, Sophia, is a camper.
- August 5 Planned and led off-Site Retreat with Council to consider proposed new Governance model.
- August 15 Conducted 1<sup>st</sup> of 7 formal staff performance reviews.
- September 17 Began leading 10-week Confirmation program with Ross Galleto,
   Corinne Ford, and Pastor Rachel. Program had 15 regular participants (18 total),
   10 of whom joined the church by confirmation at December 3.
- September 26 With Nancy Shimetz, planned and led a Service of Lamentation & Comfort with music by Paula Matzinger, Dave Peterson, and Andy DelMonte.
- October 8 Kicked off the Annual Appeal with a theme song, "We Make the Road by Walking."
- October 9 Woke up at a Ministers' Retreat in Sacramento to the news of wild fires in Sonoma and Napa counties.
- October 27 Planned and led program at Men's Retreat in Inverness with Warren Brisbin, Nathan Knuth, and Stuart Mitchell.

### **On-Going Duties:**

- Participated in monthly Church Council and Board of Trustees meetings
- Provided direct supervision for 6 staff positions: Associate Minister, Office Manager, Custodian, Director of Youth Ministries, and Minister of Music
- Worked with Personnel Committee to update our Personnel Policies / Employee Handbook
- Worked with Governance Committee to draft a major revision of the church's Bylaws.
- Conducted 7 Memorial Services: Carl Beers, Toni Wilson, Sharon Elder, Ken McHugh, Bob Harper, Bob Pforsich, Dick Huppertz, and Dorothea Rowden
- Planned weekly, monthly, and season worship services, preaching 40 sermons.

### On the Horizon:

- Pastoral I've begun to keep an updated list of pastoral care needs and look forward to nurturing a multi-faceted care ministry including an intercessory prayer network, lay visitors, and coordinated outreach efforts.
- Worshiping Life I would like for more congregants to participate in the planning and leadership of worship, including as liturgists, ushers, musicians, and artists.
   During Lent, we will be exploring the nature and practice of prayer.
- Administrative I'm looking forward to the conclusion of a process of governance change, including a revision of the Bylaws, so that new leadership can adapt and respond more nimbly over the coming years to the prompting of the Holy Spirit.
- Prophetic This congregation has much to offer the wider community in terms of its Open & Affirming stance toward people of many stripes, including gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender people. Additionally, I want us to continue our leadership role as advocates for our undocumented brothers and sisters.

- 3. Why are we here? To conspire with the Holy Spirit.

### Associate Minister to Children & Families 2017 Annual Report

Rev. Rachel Knuth

As Minister to Children and Families, much of my work supported the ministry of the Children's Ministry Team (Christian Education Committee.) Please see their article included in this Annual Report for specific programming.

2017 was a year of Continued Transition, Leadership Development, Community, and Worship:

### **Continued Transition**

Our congregation continues to grow as a community, becoming clearer about our identity and mission, and stretching to reach new goals! Hurrah!

- In September, I began leading Children's Worship in the Chapel, parallel to worship in the Sanctuary. Every week I have created a liturgy for Children's Worship, including a color-coded worship guide for the adult volunteers, recruited adults to help supervise the group of children, and worked with Pastor Brian to recruit musicians. We've averaged around 18 children in Children's Worship every week. Children's Worship includes a Bible reading, "homily," offering, Communion and a hymn of the month. The hymn of the month is then sung during Multi-Generational worship in the Sanctuary, so that the children are always building their repertoire and singing it again in church with their families.
- It was a joy to offer leadership and support for the Diaconate reorganization. It
  had become clear that the Diaconate's responsibilities were overly broad and
  needed to come into form as they move forward. I worked with the leaders to
  envision the Diaconate in four separate ministry areas, and created job
  descriptions for each of the four areas. The Diaconate Board was able to move
  forward with these job descriptions, fine-tuning them and then approving them
  for Council.
- I continued to work with my Pastoral Relations Committee, meeting monthly for support and relationship-building. We got clearer on the role of a PRC and even held a joint-PRC with Pastor Ben's committee. Pastor Ben and I worked together to create a job description for the PRC.
- In January I began supervising the newly-hired Nursery Attendants. With gratitude for the support of our Nursery Coordinator, Jenna Gonzales, our church offered Nursery care every Sunday for the year!

### **Leadership Development**

In 2017 I was delighted to both receive and offer leadership development.

- I attended the off-site Leadership Retreat, led by Pastor Ben.
- I supported the Children's Ministry Team in becoming a host church for Our Whole Lives Facilitator Training in the summer. I wore two hats at this training: the "host" hat, and the "trainee" hat. As a trainee, I received training alongside Pete Emerson and Brooke Bell, who facilitated the OWL program at our church in the Fall. This made it possible for me to be the administrator of our church's

OWL program, and to offer a class for parents of OWL students (and a substitute facilitator, as needed). It was a joy to be able to create a blessing and share some of the gifts of OWL with the congregation on OWL Sunday in November.

- I arranged for renown Godly Play Trainer, Di Pagels, to come to our church and offer a half-day Godly Play training with our Godly Play leaders. She crafted the training to address our specific group of Storytellers and Door Helpers. 13 adults attended the training and Di stayed to rearrange our materials in the proper Godly Play layout!
- I continued to offer support to our 4/5th grade Acolytes, maintaining a calendar for their participation, and training them to be "servant leaders" in the church.
- I played a supportive role in the Confirmation program this year, recruiting and coordinating mentors, subbing for Ben/Ross as needed, and writing blessings for the Confirmands, which were offered in worship on Confirmation Sunday.

### Community

The morning that I was set to pack for a week-long Christian Education ministry conference, I awoke to news of the fires. When I arrived at the church, relief efforts were already underway by church members who sought to create a "comfort station" at our church. I witnessed the leadership of amazing parishioners who cooked, prayed, listened, made coffee, sorted donations, provided medical supervision, cleaned, and communicated with other shelters. As Pastor Ben was away at a Minister's Conference, I provided a pastoral presence and leadership, communicating with community leaders and volunteers, and assisting as able. The Community Church of Sebastopol really showed up for our community throughout the firestorm and in the months following, showing that we were "burned but not consumed."

### Worship

Our church gathered for some deep, meaningful, joyful, releasing, soul-feeding Worship services in 2017, and I was delighted to participate as Associate Pastor.

- Holy Week included Maundy Thursday foot washing in the Sanctuary, Good Friday cemetery walk at Pleasant Hill Mortuary, and Good Friday ecumenical service at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church.
- Advent practices included support for the Advent Workshop and leadership of the Advent Spiral.
- I've offered leadership in Worship services throughout the year, and Pastor Ben has encouraged me to preach once per month.
- I participated in three evening services on Christmas Eve, including directing the children's nativity pageant at 4:00pm and a Children's Sermon at 6:00pm.
- I also participated in several Memorial Services, including a Children's Sermon and a Memorial Service for a community member in December.

### **Moderator 2017 Annual Report**

Patricia Raney, Moderator

This has been a year of implementing new programs and reviewing our policies, governance procedures and bylaws.

In February, Pastor Ben presented an orientation to the Council members which included the Council's mission and norms for how we operate and conduct the business of the Council.

A survey was sent to all members who had not attended any church functions for one year to inquire if they wanted to remain on the rolls as church members. As a result of the survey and follow-up phone calls, thirteen people wanted to remain members and twenty-four were moved to inactive status.

In March, twenty three people attended a leadership workshop conducted by Pastor Ben. At the end of our meeting we determined our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT). The data was compiled and shared at the April Council meeting. From this we developed next steps for going forward.

The Safe Church policy was approved by the Council in April. This policy outlines the rules and procedures for working with the children and youth to keep the children safe.

Committees and Boards were asked to complete job descriptions which include the purpose of the Committee/Board and the duties and responsibilities of each group. Completed job descriptions are kept in a binder in Ben's office.

The Financial Oversight policy was reviewed in May and ad hoc committees were established to review the Bylaws and analyze the results of the Leadership Workshop surveys.

In May the Council approved the Senior Minister as Head of Staff.

Consideration of a policy and guidelines for assisting the homeless and the wider community was reviewed in September. Pastor Ben presented a flyer of what the church offers that will be provided to people needing services.

A Governance Retreat was held at the Thomas home in August to explore the possibility for a new governance model and a revision of current bylaws. Ad hoc committees began the work of revising the bylaws and detailing information regarding the new governance proposal to present to interested members.

All staff participated in self-evaluations under the supervision of Pastor Ben. Pastor Ben's self-evaluation was reviewed by Moderator, Patricia Raney, Rachel Knuth and Jeff Boal.

The Golden Gate Association of the Northern California-Nevada Conference, UCC, held its Annual Gathering at Sonoma State University in June. Three staff and two church members attended.

The fires in October had a major impact on our county. Many members of our church were directly or indirectly affected by this tragedy. Some members lost their homes, and many victims of the fire came to the church for refuge. Although we are not designated as an emergency shelter, we opened Memorial Hall and people came from all over the county for food, supplies, and shelter. Emergency Services made deliveries throughout the next few days and church members showed up to help in any way they were able. It was amazing to me how many people came to help, drop off supplies, and ask what they could do to help.

As a result of this tragedy, Marian MacDonald suggested that we create a committee to make recommendations to ensure we are prepared in the future for disasters such as this. An Ad Hoc committee was created under Marian's direction and is creating a plan to be better prepared to respond to disaster on short notice.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to serve as your Moderator and work with the staff and Church Council. When something needs to be done, it seems there is always someone who steps up and says, "I can do that." We are truly blessed to be able to worship with so many caring and compassionate people who quietly and competently work very hard to ensure that our church is a vital part of our community.

It is customary to begin the music report with the leadership of the various parts of our music program. As in the year prior, we had a large degree of continuity spiced by some alteration. We continued with Brian Plaugher as Minister of Music, directing the Chancel Choir and coordinating our music program. Karna Roa continued to lead the Handbell Choir. Our contemporary group, the Divine Connection, was led collaboratively with Paula Matzinger, Dave Peterson, with support from Andy DelMonte and Keith Blackstone. We had a high degree of variability among our keyboard accompanists to start the year, before settling on the delightful J. Althea as our permanent pianist. Judy Peterson also contributed occasionally on organ. The position of Children's Choir Director has not been filled. It remains to be seen if or when that particular program will continue.

The faithful offerings of the Handbell Choir, other instrumentalists, and our vocal choirs all contributed their gifts to Sunday mornings and special worship occasions. As usual, the children under the direction of Rachel Knuth performed to the enjoyment of the congregation at the Christmas Eve pageant to an overflowing crowd. We continued to hear occasionally from our jazz ensemble, New Orleans style, and also from ensembles coordinated by Keith Blackstone. The Divine Connection performed regularly during the year including Easter, Advent and other celebratory occasions. We also heard from our wind ensemble on special Sundays.

A new occasion for accompanying worship developed outside the view of the primary congregation, as children now depart for a separate chapel worship after the children's story. The need remains strong for volunteers willing to support that simple service with vocal or instrumental accompaniment. Please consider trying it out if you can.

As usual, many vocal and instrumental soloists and small groups delightfully filled the summer months when our larger ensembles took a break. We are always interested to include new or occasional singers or instrumentalists – please consider joining us to share in music. We have maintained an ongoing effort to sing people's favorite hymns. ### Christian Education 2017 Annual Report

2017 has been a very busy and blessed year. The Christian Education committee has continued to focus on the mission of our church to, "worship God and share the love of Jesus Christ, teaching the message of Jesus to all ages and putting our faith into action."

Our Christian Education Committee consisted of Rev. Rachel Knuth, Brooke Bell, Paula Berndt, Kristen DelMonte, Mary McMillon, and Leslie Wood. Together, we met monthly to discuss the faith formation of the children in our church.

### **MADD Camp:**

The Christian Education Committee, Pastor Rachel, and Youth Leader Ross Galleto put on our week-long Music-Art-Dance-Drama/Discovery Camp. Pianist Althea offered musical leadership. The theme was "Old Turtle" and included the children making a giant turtle that they processed into church during their musical offering in worship. 23 children participated in the camp, along with Middle and High School youth who helped lead the camp for the week.

### **Our Whole Lives Training:**

This past summer, the Christian Education committee host an Our Whole Lives Sexuality and our Faith training for facilitators from various UCC and Unitarian Universalist congregations in Northern California.

### Our Whole Lives Class for 4/5th graders:

This fall we embarked on our first Our Whole Lives class for our 4th and 5th graders. 8 children participated. The class lasted 10 weeks and Brooke Bell and Pete Emerson facilitated.

### Faith Formation:

Our biggest change in Christian Education took place this fall. We began the Faith Formation hour from 9-10am and shifted Godly Play and Our Whole Lives Sexuality and our Faith to the 9am educational hour. With the new addition of Faith Formation, we have also created Children's Worship in Faith Chapel during regular worship.

### **Godly Play**:

During Faith Formation, our youngest children continued our Godly Play program for preschool-3rd graders. Godly Play is a Montessori-based curriculum that uses handmade wooden objects to tell Bible stories. The story is presented by a storyteller and another adult (the doorperson), helps by holding the sacred space and helping create a worship centered atmosphere.

### **Bibles for 5th graders**:

We presented our 5th graders with Bibles in the Spring, calling each of them by name during worship.

### Advent Workshop:

Our Advent Workshop was guided with the intention of bringing all generations together in relationship and creating a meaningful home practice of candle-lighting during Advent. We offered a sit-down lunch at tables, with conversation questions to encourage multi-generational sharing over a meal. After the dishes were cleared, we moved on to crafting – coloring giant Advent posters and creating Advent wreaths to take home, along with a beautiful weekly devotional.

### **Advent Spiral**:

The Christian Education Committee created an Advent Spiral in the Chapel on the first Sunday of Advent. 24 people (a multi-generational group) participated in this walking meditation to celebrate the light growing in the darkness.

### Deacon 2017 Annual Report

The Deacons have spent this year reevaluating all the responsibilities that have fallen on our plate. These include leading kindred groups, organizing ushering and lay readers, Lenten soup suppers, new members' lunches, and pastoral care for rides and short-term meals. We have decided that it is unrealistic to continue with that load.

The new organizational model consists of four teams: worship (ushering), lay visitation (including offering communion to our home bound members), membership and fellowship (integrating new members) and kindred groups. The kindred group model has met with mixed results. The new model will be basically for parish care (short-term meals and ride providers) and will include all members of the congregation within Sonoma County. Each group can decide if they want to do more than that (usher, socialize, study group).

Mission and Outreach works to provide the congregation with information and opportunities to help others. A big thank you to the congregation for the support you have given to our activities this year! Many people and organizations have been helped, both locally and abroad by our congregation.

#### Highlights of 2017

Encouraged by our Senior Pastor, Ben Broadbent, the church participated in all four of the UCC special offerings this year as noted below.

One Great Hour of Sharing - \$2,596 was received to support ministries funding health, education and agricultural development, emergency relief refugee ministries and both domestic and international disaster response Strengthening the Church - \$601 was received to support church growth, pastoral and lay leadership development, and young adult ministries Neighbors in Need - This offering supporting the Council for American Indian Ministry and the Justice and Witness Ministries received \$1,750.

UCC Christmas Fund - provides direct financial assistance tor retired and active UCC ministers, lay employees, and surviving spouses. \$1,556 was Received

Youth Mission Trip – A gift basket was provided by committee members for auction to support this year's middle school and high school mission trips.

Shoebox Ministry and Gift Card Tree – The week prior to Christmas, 115 shoeboxes filled with personal care items and an additional 42 sets of socks, underwear, gloves, and a scarf were delivered to the Homeless Service Center. A large box of underwear and socks was kept for the church office to distribute to people needing the who arrive at our church office. Gift Cards were received with a value of \$695 for displaced SRJC students due to the October wildfires.

Alternative Gifts - \$2,901 worth of alternative gifts were given by members of our church.

Adult Mission Trip – 17 men and women drove to Weed, CA, to help rebuild homes damaged by wildfire that burned into town. We worked hard, sweated a lot and had a great time. Access to Frank and Kathy Mayhew's large home in nearby Mt. Shasta was a special treat.

<u>Interchurch Food Pantry</u> – Our church continues to provide the majority of the funding and volunteers for this multi-congregation effort to meet local hunger needs. Suzanne Albin is now the Pantry Board's Treasurer succeeding Connie Blackstone.

#### **Local Homeless Support**

- Every 2nd Saturday our church provides a hot lunch to local residents in need.
- Over1000 free Thanksgiving meal were served out of Memorial Hall organized by Roger & Linda Collins.
- For more than two years we have providing 5 overnight parking space to homeless households supervised by Catholic Charities and strongly supported by the Sebastopol PD. Due to financial constraints, Catholic Charities ended this program at our church mid-year to focus on moving the homeless into more permanent housing.
- During the year the church office issued

500 bus passes,

150 snack bags,

125 pairs of socks/clothing items

1200 hot showers with clean towels, soap & shampoo

This year's church budget provided a significant increase in discretionary funding. As a result, the Board distributed \$750 each to *The Anthill Foundation* which provides bathrooms in rural schools in Uganda to encourage maturing girls to continue attending school; *The Living Room*, a day shelter for homeless women and their children; and *The Sebastopol Senior Center*. An additional \$900 was sent to *Catholic Charities* to be used to support its services to the homeless, day care and respite services to people with dementia and their caregivers, and counseling on immigration issues. Following hurricanes in Texas, Florida, and Puerto Rico, \$1,120.40 was sent to *UCC Disaster Ministries*.

In 2017, both the Middle School and High School youth groups spent a busy year developing what it means to be communities of active faith. The youth groups spent time developing what they believed to be the most important aspects of their faith journeys through multiple service projects and discussion groups.

In the summer, our Middle School Youth Group went to San Jose and was graciously hosted by First Congregational Church of San Jose, UCC. They spent a day learning about urban development and the importance of maintaining vegetation by planting trees in neighborhoods that lacked them.. They spent another day listening to a multifaith discussion panel and a surprise visit to Gurdwara Sahib, one of the largest Sikh temples outside of India.

Then, our High School Youth Group took a trip to Los Angles, CA, to participate in service work centered on homeless outreach through the DOOR Network. We spent a week with three other youth groups from across the country staying at the Hollywood Presbyterian Church just one block from the Hollywood Boulevard. We participated in work with Habitat for Humanity, Project Angel Food, The LA Food Bank, and other outreach organizations.

In the Fall our Middle School worked through a12 week curriculum called "Echo the Story" that gives a crash course on the Bible through discussion, art and creative writing.

Our High School Group participated in a Confirmation Plus class. We had 15 regular participants, who worked with Pastor Benjamin, Pastor Rachel, and Ross to dig deep into conversations on what it means to be baptized and be a member of the church. We had 9 students Confirm their Baptism at eh beginning of December.

We owe deep gratitude to an incredible group of youth leaders. Leaders for the 2017 Middle Youth Group this year were Dakota Blackstone, and Beth Larssen. Youth Leaders for the 2017 High School Youth Group was Corinne Ford. These leaders faithfully guided our youth this year for which we are grateful.
