General Purpose: Supports the mission of The Community Church of Sebastopol by providing piano and organ music in support of the worshiping life of the congregation.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities:

- Coordinates with Pastors and Minister of Music to select music for Sunday services according to liturgical seasons and individual Sunday themes.
- Rehearses and provides organ and piano music for Sunday morning services, including Prelude, Postlude, Offertory, and Hymn accompaniment.

- Rehearses with and accompanies Chancel Choir.
- Accompanies Handbell Ensemble, Children's Choir, and other groups as needed.
- Provides music for additional church events, including worship services at times other than Sunday mornings.
- As available, provides music for memorial services and weddings (additional fees paid by family/couple).
- Monitors Piano, Organ, and other keyboards, as needed, for repairs and reports needs to Minister of Music.
- Maintains a list of available back-up pianists and organists.
- Other duties as assigned by the supervisor.
